AVIATION ISSUES.

The organisation that wishes to develop Redhill Aerodrome (Redhill Aerodrome Ventures, or RAV for short) has submitted a scheme to provide an airport carrying 20 million passengers a year. It would allow for 240,000 aircraft movements (take-off and landing) per year, or put another way 674 aircraft per day, between the hours of 6.30am and 10.00pm. Gatwick Airport **at present** has 260,000 movements per year. Interested? Contact www.kragnet.co.uk for further details, including a map of the area involved.

ROAD REPAIRS.

Further to comments made in the previous issue of the "Outwood News" your Council has been in communication with the County Highways Department concerning the state of the roads in the village.

There are many areas of concern, but the flooding outside the "Brightleigh" complex, which has been going on for years will hopefully be dealt with this autumn. The overflowing ditch in Wasp Green Lane, which caused considerable distress to a residential property earlier in the year, will also be rectified.

There are also two major "humps" appearing in Millers Lane (between "The Dairy" and "Wasp Well"). The surface around two manhole covers appears to be cracked and rising dangerously. Both could subsequently collapse. They are due to be inspected shortly, and appropriate action will hopefully be taken. The Highways Department will be closely monitored in these areas.

LLOYD HALL CAR PARK
