Rector's Ramblings

April this year (as it often is) is the month in which we celebrate Easter, on 9th April. A month later, we shall be celebrating the coronation of King Charles III on 6th May and the two events are connected to

each other in a deep but not immediately

obvious way.



The coronation will include an anointing ceremony in which the King is anointed with oil on his head, heart and hands. The holy oil which will be used to anoint King Charles was blessed last month at The Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. The church goes back to the 4th century AD and was established by Helena, the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine when she travelled to the Holy Land and identified the site where the church is as the location of the crucifixion. burial and resurrection of Jesus. I have only visited it once, many years ago now, but it left a lasting impression on me. It is a place that has been prayed in and revered by millions of Christians over the centuries and includes, between the rock of the crucifixion and the tomb of Jesus, a large slab of stone, revered as the rock on which Jesus' body was laid and anointed before burial. It is because of that anointing that the Holy Sepulchre is considered the holiest place for oil to be blessed and for many centuries our monarchs have been anointed with oil blessed there.

The holy oil used for anointing is olive oil. The olives used for King Charles' oil grew on the Mount of Olives, just outside of Jerusalem and at the foot of which is the Garden of Gethsemane (the word Gethsemane means olive press in Hebrew), where Jesus prayed before his crucifixion. Olive oil is a wonderful natural product and as well as

the nourishing life-enhancing benefits associated with eating it, it has since ancient times been used as soothing balm for skin and joints (and associated with this as a basis for fragrant perfumes) and as a source of light when burnt in oil lamps. These physical properties and uses have meant that from ancient times olive oil has come to represent the presence of God as life, love and light as well as, through its association with the olive branch from which it comes, God as peace.

We associate chocolate with Easter but olive oil is, in fact, at the heart of the Easter story. Perhaps you might like to have a little anointing ceremony yourself this year to celebrate Easter. Your olive oil doesn't need to have been blessed at the Holy Sepulchre (special as that oil is). All olive oil is special. Just put a put a bit on your finger and make the sign of the cross by touching your forehead, chest and both shoulders and as you do so say "May the life, love, light and peace of God be within me".

And whether you do that or not, I would like to wish you the life, love, light and peace of God this Easter.



NATURE WATCH

fter the driest February in recent years March kicked off with some more cold weather bringing light snow, overnight frost to brown off any early bloom from the less hardy species and hoar frost on the lawns and car windscreens. The wind direction moved to northerlies – straight from the north, north westerlies or north easterlies – but all with rain and lots of it. Despite some warm, sunny spells in daytime the nights remained generally cold so that plant growth was put in check. The white squirrel seen around the Wasp Green area put in a few odd appearances before retreating to the protection of its drey. The shroud of white fleece over the apricot blossom was thankfully put in place in good time and other similar ghost-like looking trees were spotted in one or two other gardens. Two or three buzzards could be regularly seen quartering the fields off Dayseys Hill and a pair of red kites started to put in a regular appearance. Meanwhile back in the garden the feeding stations were busier than ever with the mixed seed requiring a refill every day and peanuts every four days.

Apart from predators such as sparrow hawks and the occasional inter-specie fights between competing cock birds and the odd tussle over food, birds always seem to keep to a clear pecking order and rarely seem to go out of their way to pick a fight. The large flocks of sparrows, blue tits and great tits, mixed in with robins, wrens, tree creepers, chaffinches are all after seed at this time of year. They patiently take it in turn to visit the feeder, grab a beak-full and fly back to their perch in the hedge to eat the seed and at the same time avoid the attention of any sparrow hawks. Then their places on the feeder are taken by the next in line regardless of species. However, if starlings or greater spotted woodpeckers arrive, they all hold back to let the larger bird take its fill and leave before they then continue their feeding. Meanwhile ground feeders such as wood pigeons, doves, rooks and jackdaws together with the odd robin and sparrow happily feed around each other with only the occasional shove to warn others to keep their distance.

Despite the cold weather leaf and flower buds continued to slowly swell. Out in the fields and woodland there were plenty of soft yellow primroses, lesser celandines in protected spots, blackthorns at various stages of flowering with the best yet to come and even a young horse chestnut, along the track down to Hookhouse Farm was covered with white sticky buds.

In the garden early magnolias and camellias were in flower by the mid-March as were swathes of golden yellow daffodils everywhere, which were followed by an early Japanese cherry - Prunus incisa Kojo-No-Mai. The great celebration of cherry blossom time is, of course, "sakura" in Japan from late March through April. Talking cherry trees brings to mind the name of the Captain Collingwood "Cherry" Ingram the plant hunter known for his immense contribution to the research on and promotion of cherry trees in Japan particularly the saving of the variety The Great White – Prunus serrulate "Tai Haku".

In the early 1970's we were on a break in Kent and on a tip off visited his garden at The Grange in Benenden. He was 96 at the time and kindly gave us a conducted tour of his garden and a few bulbs of the rare scilla bithynica, which he collected and grew in his garden which have now self-seeded beautifully in ours.

Hopefully by the time you read this, Spring will have truly arrived. It is an exciting and busy time of year with The Elections and the King's Coronation.

The table below summarises the process for the election. I won't bore you any more about this. ELECTION TIMETABLE

Publication of Notice of Election

Close of Nominations

Nomination Papers will be available shortly from Tandridge District Council offices in Oxted. If there are more candidates than seats available there will be a contested election. If there are fewer candidates than seats available, or the exact number of candidates to fill the vacancies, there will be no election and everyone that has submitted a valid nomination will become a Parish Councillor in an uncontested election. If there are fewer candidates than seats, the vacancies will be filled by co-option after the first meeting of the council (providing it is quorate, in Outwood's case 3 members required).

Ultimately, democracy is served through elections, and that requires local residents to step forward with a wish to serve their local community.



Regarding THE KING'S CORONATION -

The Parish Council has suggested that the best day for a community 'event' will be on Monday 8th May. Residents are asked to bring their own food and drink for a picnic the grounds of Lloyd Hall (indoors if wet). It is also the wish of His Majesty that communities undertake some voluntary work for their locality on this day. The Parish Council has consulted the Lloyd Hall Committee and it is their wish that the following tasks be undertaken, if that is the residents' wish:

Dig holes for new signboard

Clear out back store room (show store) – approximately 6 people (most needed) Deep clean the kitchens, but not ovens – 3-4 people

If you could come suitably attired that would be great.
