WARDEN'S WARBLING



Dear Outwood News Readers,

At the end of March we altered our clocks to Summertime. Now we are in April. Moving that one-hour forward has certainly made a difference in giving us lighter evenings. We are glad to leave behind the signs and experiences of winter as we welcome in the brighter and warmer spring days. We respond to that change. Other changes around us lift our spirits with flower blooms, tree blossom, bird song and warmth.

We meet our friends and relations both adults and children. We happily greet them and catch up with all the news. Perhaps one of them has adopted a new hair style or changed its cut. We are quick to notice, and even comment on how nice it looks and what a difference it makes!

There is a famous song, in fact considered one of the best written and recorded over half a century or more ago by Dinah Washington, called "What a Difference a Day Makes". That song is an expression we use on many occasions - when tears turn into smiles, when worry has been lifted and when torrential rain on one day is followed by sunshine the next. We acknowledge that, over two consecutive days, situations can radically change for the good and we are quick to recognise the upturn.

How many of us have sat with a pencil and played the game called "Spot the Difference"? At different levels of difficulty, two sketched pictures are presented side by side, set to test one's power of observation to find the differences the artist deliberately made between them.

In our homes and gardens changes and improvements are often undertaken. Afterwards the comment is frequently made about what a difference has been made, the implication being a good difference and that it would have been an idea to have made the change sooner.

How often do people within a family get compared with one another? A remark is sometimes said that they are "as different as chalk and cheese".

One of the big grocery store chains has a slogan attached to its superior brand, that of "Taste the Difference".

A chair might be a bit uncomfortable in height or sitting amgle. A cushion strategically placed could make all the difference. Similarly, it would be helping one's eyes from the sun's glare by putting on sunglasses - so making all the difference.

There is also the word "indifference" which presents another angle on things and I believe that to present a less positive outlook - one of apathy, showing little interest or concern. The word 'difference' brings in comparisons when it is suggested to us that one thing or situation is different from another.

So, what is this "warbling" all about?

Making a difference is something that each of us, young or old, adults and children alike, can do; something to make where we live and our own and others' circumstances better. The extra smile passed on could be the moment of warmth received by another person. Words of praise given, acknowledging something well done, could be the encouragement that triggers further progress. A 'thank you', recognising even a small kindness, lifts the spirit. Many of the most cherished things in our lives are not simply bought in a shop. They are not in a cupboard to be accessed whenever wanted. They are often not seen, yet they are recognised. These are namely the kindnesses we can offer, that we can give to others, when we remember "to to do unto others as you would like them to do unto you".

Whoever we are, wherever we are and whatever our circumstances, each of us can, through small kindnesses, make a difference to those with whom we "live, work, move and have our being".

This is something within our power to adopt and implement right away and in so doing we will have contributed to making our little part of the world a better place - yes, to make a valuable difference.

NATURE WATCH

Spring has sprung the grass has riz I wonder where the birdies is. The birds are on the wing, But that's absurd The wings are on the bird. *Anon*

his piece of doggerel, often known as the Bronx poem, seems to me to be an apt link to the absurdity of the constant rainfall and mild temperatures of this spring. Record rainfall in February followed by what looks like becoming another record for March, very mild conditions and spring a good three weeks ahead of itself. We have tulips flowering in mid-March now that is absurd or more likely a taste of climate change. However, we should be grateful that it has not been like the winter snowstorm of 1962/63. It was our second Christmas in a small cottage in Mugswell near Lower Kingswood, when it started snowing on Boxing Day and by the time the blizzard conditions eased, we found that we were snowed in with narrow lanes blocked with two metre drifts and we had to take a sledge down to the local pub to collect milk for families in our small hamlet. The council eventually cleared a single track through the snow leaving walls of icy snow each side, which did not clear until the big melt came half way through March. Tulips and daffodils were a little late that year. Back to the present and on the bright side plants have been flowering much earlier than usual and lighting up the dull wet days we've been having. The soft, butter yellow primroses have been everywhere, peeking out from under hedgerows, scattered along footpaths, amongst light woodland and, as mentioned last month, on the common, at the top end of Millers Lane, where they have been putting on a better show than ever. Wood anemones started showing locally in early March and by the end of the month will be carpeting our woodlands with their white bell like blooms. Also, at the time of writing, the flower buds of lesser celandine (Ficaria vernus) are beginning to break giving patches of glistening deep yellow stars. Lesser celandine is native to Europe and western Asia. The plant prefers damp, shady, conditions and spreads very easily - it was introduced for its decorative value to a number of countries including North America where it is now treated as an invasive plant. Like many other wild plants, it was included in the lexicon of folk medicine as a treatment for eye, throat and skin diseases as well as piles which gave it the local name Pilewort. I've yet to spot a dog violet in bloom, unlike Pat Hewitt who told me she had just seen one when we met whilst dog-walking.

Like most other gardens ours has been bursting with spring blooms. Daffodils are already going over but tulips, blue and white scillas, grape hyacinths and polyanthas are continuing the show together with flowering shrubs such as the yellow blooms of forsythia and kerria japonica, plus the magnificent flowers of magnolia and camellias. The magnolia (*soulangeana*), which we bought 50 years ago years ago, now stands at over 15 metres and is covered with pink flowers. Because of the mild conditions this is the first time in years that the flowers have not been tinged with brown edges or completely burnt by frosts.

SMALLFIELD - ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENT WORKS

These began in mid February and will take (at least) a couple of months to complete:

- The speed table in the centre of Smallfield will be replaced with a more effective one.
- The parking bays outside the chemist on Redehall Road will be removed and a pedestrian crossing installed.
- Wheelers Lane will become no entry at the Post office end and the pavement extended out to fill half the Lane.
- The width restrictor in Wheelers Lane will be replaced with one that covers one side of the road to make it clear who has priority.

To minimise disruption a new carpark, Smallfield Village Car Park, has been opened on Redehall Road just beyond the shops heading towards Copthorne. Surrey County Council will be providing street signs to direct drivers. The car park will be open during the day and locked at night.

Centenary Hall carpark will be used for contractors resulting in less parking at the Hall and we are encouraged to use the new car park.

A business loading bay has been assigned on Wheelers Lane and car drivers are asked not to occupy these to prevent congestion from delivery vehicles having to park on Redehall Road.

IT'S ALMOST TIME TO ELECT SURREY'S NEXT POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

The election will take place on 2nd May at the same time as local elections in the Tandridge district. There's a few new changes voters need to be aware of.

This is the fourth time Surrey residents will go to the polling stations to vote for their Police and Crime Commissioner since the role was introduced across England and Wales in 2012.

The Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) oversees how crime is tackled in the county and holds the police force to account on Surrey residents' behalf to make sure they are providing an effective and efficient service. The Commissioner also works with the Chief Constable to set the overall direction for the force through the Police and Crime Plan and proposes the amount of Council Tax that will go towards policing from Surrey residents.

To vote on 2nd May, residents must be registered by Tuesday 16th April. It's only necessary to register once unless your details have changed – including name or address. Young people who have recently turned 18 need to register. It only takes a few minutes and can be done online at gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Another important thing for residents to remember is to bring a valid Voter ID/Photo ID to the polling station. This was introduced last year. A wider range of ID is accepted including a passport, driving license, disabled or older person's Bus Pass funded by the UK Government, and a biometric immigration document. Residents without an accepted form of photo ID can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate (VAC).

This year PCC elections will also use the first past the post voting method rather than the supplementary voting system used in previous years. This means voters will vote for only one candidate as in other elections.


