CHURCH NEWS

Rector's Ramblings

Last month I led an end of year leavers' assembly for Burstow School. For Burstow School, but not in Burstow School. I was in my garden, filming the assembly for them to watch in school. A whole school year has gone by without me being able to go into the school. I would never have thought when I filmed my leavers' assembly last July that I would still be unable to go in a year later.

Last year I showed them my vegetable patch and I did the same again this year. I said how another year had passed and here I was again, talking about my vegetables – like my assembly last year but different too.



Another year and things have changed, my garden is similar to last year but different: new seeds have been planted, new plants have grown. And I said how it was the same for them: that despite all we've been through and all the difficulties we've faced, new seeds of learning had been planted in them and they have grown – grown not just in size but grown in knowledge, grown in understanding, grown as a person. A lot of growing had happened over the last year – for my garden and for them.

I then said that a year is the length of time it takes for the earth to circle the sun – whether you measure that from January 1st or the end of one school year to another – and how that was like the circle of life, which is also the name of a song from the musical 'The Lion King':

From the day we arrive on the planet and blinking, step into the sun, There's more to see than can ever be seen, more to do than can ever be done. There's far too much to take in here, more to find than can ever be found But the sun rolling high through the sapphire sky Keeps great and small on the endless round.

It's the Circle of Life and it moves us all Through despair and hope, through faith and love Till we find our place on the path unwinding In the Circle, the Circle of Life.

And then I said, as the earth circles round the sun, the seasons change. Summer turns to Autumn, Autumn to Winter and Winter to Spring, and for my garden Spring is the beginning of the circle of life. Spring is when plants 'spring' out from the ground. That's why the season is called Spring.

I showed them a metal spring and pointed out how, if you look at a spring end on, you just see a circle, but if you look at it from the side you see a spiral. And I said that the circle of life is more like a spiral. Another year has gone round and they have grown, upwards in height and grown up in other ways as well. And growth means change – and that's a simple fact of life.

I finished by reading out from a Fathers' Day card that Hannah, one of my daughters, sent me last year and which I keep on my desk. In it she said:

To Dad

Happy Fathers' Day

I always remember you saying the following words to me and I always appreciate them:

To live is to learn

To learn is to grow

To grow is to live

And so the circle of life begins again.

And then she added:

Thank you for always having the right words to say.

I think a lot about my words, what I say to people, what I say in my sermons and what I say in these Rector's Ramblings. People are often telling me they read what I write here in the magazine. I hope you find my words food for thought and that they might just in some small way help you along the path unwinding in the circle of life – because even though your time and my time at primary school might be a long time ago now, we're never too old to grow!



NATURE WATCH

It is just so British to talk about the weather and this year has been, to say the least, up and down like a yo-yo. June was mainly a month of rain with north easterly winds, which carried on into early July but once again high pressure took over and by the third week of the month the sun came out, the temperature soared and topped 30°C in Outwood. Butterflies such as meadow browns appeared in large numbers mixed with a few small whites and red admirals and the grass in the fields was constantly twitching with the movement of common green grasshoppers (*Omocestus viridulus*).

Gardening talk these days is more and more about the natural world. Back in the 1980/90's a more naturalistic approach to garden design was first developed by Dutch landscape designer Piet Oudolph but has since moved on and gardening pundits, who previously praised striped, mown lawns, are now advocating the development of wild flower meadows with its benefits for wild flowers and wildlife as a whole. Outwood started down this track when in 2003, following my proposal to the newly formed parish council, the decision was made to take over the responsibility for the maintenance of the grassy area on Dayseys Hill from Surrey County Council with the objective of creating a wildflower meadow. The plan was firstly to plant two groups of trees including the wild chequer (Sorbus torminalis) - this year carrying a good crop of fruits - in the days of yore these were used to make small beer and it is reputed that landscaper Capability Brown banned the planting of the tree on his estates to avoid the ravages of local villagers. Secondly, cutting the area once a year after seed setting and removing the material to gradually impoverish the soil to the benefit of wild flowers and thirdly removing infestations of docks and ragwort. I conducted a survey at the time which showed there were 67 species of wild flowers and various grasses, sub shrubs and trees but the density was low due to rank grasses. Here we are now eighteen years later and despite, at times, a rather random cutting schedule and the failure to make proper use of yellow rattle, the result is that grasses have decreased and the density of wild flower species have grown substantially. This year the patches of vetches, particularly the purple or common vetch and the yellow, meadow vetchling, can be clearly seen when driving by and a walk down the well mown central pathway will reveal the hidden delights.

A wild flower meadow was also the subject of a meeting with Michael Lane in his garden near the windmill in early July where he started creating one some four years ago. He said it was probably a bit late to start but then it is never too late for nature. The wide variety of wild flowers included common spotted orchids, various vetches, knapweed about to bloom and yellow rattle (*Rhinanthus minor*), which still carried a few of their yellow tubular flowers and increasing numbers of the large seed pods, which when dry rattle as the wind blows through them. This plant, which is an annual and, although helpful to wild flowers, is heartily disliked by farmers because it can be poisonous to livestock. It has a plethora of dialect names which provide an indication of how it was viewed; Baby's Rattle in Somerset; Penny Rattle in Sussex; Money Grass in Leicestershire and Snaffles in Kent.

WHAT HAS NOW CHANGED IN ENGLAND?

Social distancing

No limits on how many people can meet

1m-plus guidance removed (except in some places like hospitals and passport control when entering)

Face coverings no longer required by law, although the government still "expects and recommends" them in crowded and enclosed spaces

Some shops and transport operators will still require masks

Events and gatherings

Nightclubs can reopen

Pubs and restaurants no longer table-service only

No limits on guests at weddings and funerals

No limits on people attending concerts, theatres or sports events

No restrictions on communal worship

Travel

Guidance recommending against travel to amber list countries removed Under-18s and fully vaccinated adults no longer have to self-isolate after visiting amber list countries - although those returning from France to the UK must still quarantine for 10 days

Other changes

Limits on visitors to care homes will be removed.

From 16 August, most Covid restrictions in schools - including "bubbles" - will end. From the same date, fully vaccinated adults will not need to self-isolate after contact with a positive case.

FLYTIPPING

Flytipping is the illegal dumping of waste and fines of up to £50,000 in Magistrates' Courts can be given or unlimited amounts in Higher Courts and prison sentences of up to five years.

Flytipping can cause pollution and harm the environment, human health, animals and wildlife. It is also expensive to clear up and is an ongoing problem to landowners and farmers. We work with landowners to identify offenders and will prosecute where appropriate.

We offer a reward of up to £500 for information which leads to a successful prosecution in cases of flytipping.

We deal promptly with flytipped material on our land or highways and provide advice to landowners affected by flytipping.

Anyone who removes rubbish from your property must be registered to do so – you can check if a waste carrier is registered online.

Do not give your waste to anyone not registered. If it is later found flytipped you will have committed an offence.

Illegal waste sites that store or burn waste should be reported to the Environment Agency on their incident hotline 03708 506 506.

In brief, the results of the study show that it is technically possible to develop an environmentally friendly community heat network in the village, but unfortunately with the removal of government schemes, a heat network is not currently financially viable. The Outwood project is currently on-hold therefore.

Whilst it is disappointing that we are not moving forward for now, the results of projects such as ours is applying pressure on the government to move climate change up the agenda.

And we are a big step ahead if/when renewable energy heat networks do become an attractive alternative.
