

ESME HILL

15th October 1929 – 28th October 2021

Esme came to Outwood from Battersea with her parents and sister Janet in 1956 when her father was appointed the verger at the church. Esme loved her move to the countryside and threw herself into church and village life. However, she continued to commute back up to London for work as a secretary for Constable, the publishers and others. She had to retire at 60 but Esme wasn't ready to give up work so got a job as secretary at a printers in Guildford and then worked for Patrick McIntosh.

After her father died in 1978, Esme's mother, helped by Esme, became verger and when she could no longer carry on, Esme formally took over the post which she held for the next 30 years. As well as setting up the church for Sunday services, she prepared for and attended all baptisms, weddings and funerals, kept the church registers as well as many other duties connected to the smooth running of the church.

Esme started the Sunday school with Janet. This was something she loved and working with the children brought her a lot of joy and happiness. She carried on until the Sunday School was transferred to South Nutfield Church when the two churches combined in Revd Trevor Kemp's time.

Esme was always passionate about music. She took over the church choir and taught herself to play the organ, becoming the church organist. She also, along with her sister Janet, became a bell ringer. With her secretarial skills, it was natural that Esme became Church Secretary, a position that she held for 40 years.

Esme also started what became the Outwood News. Each month she would use the Roneo and run off sheets in the vestry – in those days it wasn't in the magazine form that it is now. She also became secretary of the Outwood Horticultural Society helping to organise the shows. All her endeavours were recognised when she was presented with an award by Tandridge District Council for her work in the church and community.

Esme was part of the fabric of Outwood church and village and she will be sadly missed by so many of us.

Rector's Ramblings

Supermarkets love their Christmas TV adverts. You may have seen Aldi's one this year, an adaptation of Charles Dickens's A Christmas Carol using vegetables as characters! It's called A Christmas Carrot by Charles Chickens in which Ebenezer Scrooge becomes Ebanana Scrooge and the Spirit of Christmas Present is played by Kevin the Carrot. Kevin takes Ebanana on a flying journey, showing him Christmas as a time of 'peas and goodwill' to all and introduces him to Marcus Radishford, who in Kevin's words is 'always helping children'. Like his Dickens counterpart, Ebanana becomes a changed person and starts to treat everyone with kindness, generosity and compassion, embodying the spirit of Christmas.



The advert ends with the line: "The moral of the story? The answer you'll find: for you to be happy, you need to be kind."

The word kind has the same root as the word kin. Our next of kin is our next of kind. To be kind nowadays means to be caring and loving. But it comes from the idea that we treat our next of kin or kind in a kindly, loving way. The Dalai Lama often says, "My religion is very simple. My religion is kindness". Jesus said that we should love our neighbour as ourselves and when asked by someone, "Who is my neighbour?" he answers with the parable of the Good Samaritan, which ends by telling us not who our neighbour is but how we can be a good neighbour by showing kindness to others who are in need.

Charles Dickens knew what it was like to be in need. His father got into financial difficulties and was sent to the Marshalsea, a debtors' prison in Southwark. Charles, aged 12, was forced to pawn his collection of books, leave school and work at a dirty and rat-infested shoe-blacking factory in order to help his family. Marcus Rashford (whose voice we hear when his radish counterpart speaks) also knows what it's like to be in need. Speaking about his part in the advert he said of his childhood:

"As a family, we relied on the local food bank to get our Christmas dinner. To this day, I remember queueing outside that building with mum, mum feeling embarrassed that she might be recognised ... For many children in situations like mine growing up, there is very little expectation around this time of year; add the impact of the pandemic and the very least they deserve is a Christmas dinner."

He was awarded an MBE by the Duke of Cambridge last month for his campaign to support vulnerable children and recognised for his efforts last summer to ensure no child in need went hungry during lockdown.

Being kind to others is important, but so is being kind to ourselves. Jesus says we should "love our neighbour as ourselves", so, in other words, we need to love ourselves first before we can love others. Loving ourselves, being kind to ourselves, is not a selfish thing. We can only care properly for others, be kind to others, if we care for and are kind to ourselves first. But this is not always easy and sometimes it takes someone being kind to us to help us do that – which is what happens to Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol* when he experiences the kindness of his nephew Fred and of Tiny Tim. We need to be open not just to showing kindness but also to receiving kindness from others.

This message of kindness is embodied in the angels' message to the shepherds when they announce the birth of Jesus. A message not quite of 'peas and goodwill' but of peace and goodwill, two words summed up by the one word, kindness, a word that also sums up the spirit of Christmas. Kindness changes Scrooge for the better and kindness changes us all for the better too. A changed Scrooge says, "I will honour Christmas in my heart and try to keep it all the year." That is a good Christmas and New Year message for each one of us.



NATURE WATCH

here had been three in late 2007, two in 2008 and the last one was seen in 2009. A sight in Outwood that had been regular for a few years came to an end because as Brian Hibbard, the National Trust ranger at the time told me "the last one was killed yesterday by a car". Brian was talking about the surviving member of the trio of white squirrels that were often to be spotted scurrying through the trees, or quickly flashing across the road around the top end of Wasp Green Lane at the junction with Millers Lane and the wooded area up to the old school. My first and last sighting had been in 2008 whilst walking with the dog on the corner near Wasp Well. However, it was on a walk, yet again with the dog, late afternoon in early November that, just five metres away, I saw a young white squirrel busily probing the ground under trees opposite Wasp Green Farm. I stopped, with Tess firmly on the lead, and watched, spellbound for a few seconds, before I remembered my camera, but by the time I had fished it out of my pocket the little beauty had spotted us and made a rapid exit up a tree. I mentioned my sighting to a couple walking towards me and suggested they keep their eyes peeled. Almost immediately they looked up and said "there it is" - the first time ever for both of them. I saw the same animal a couple of days later, close to the first sighting, searching around a large pile of apples that had been left in the undergrowth. In a chat with Gerald Sharpe I learnt that he'd seen it a few times and by a roundabout route I found that Di MacDonald had not only seen it but been quick enough to take a photograph. From the small size it would most likely have been born this year and one can only hope that after leaf fall it survives the attention of buzzards and other birds of prey. It seems that the gene for white fur has remained in the bloodline of the local squirrels. There are two white coated variations of the grey squirrel, the albino with pink eyes and nose, and the leuco form, with black nose and eyes, which is our one.

The grey squirrel (*Sciurus carolinensis*) is just one of over 260 species worldwide and was introduced to the UK from North America, in the late 19th century, by wealthy landowners and currently the UK population is estimated to be over 2.5 million. They can produce two litters a year of 3/4 kits and have a lifespan of between 2 - 4 years. They are heavier than the red squirrels, the population of which has been decimated by a pox carried by the greys and they can now be found only in the north and west of the UK with small protected pockets in the west, including Tresco in the Isles of Scilly. Their front legs have four nails/toes and the back legs - which are double jointed - five, all of which allows them to run up and down tree-trunks at high speed.
