Rector's Ramblings

“At Christmas, our attention is drawn to the birth of a baby some two thousand years ago. It was the humblest of beginnings, and his parents, Joseph and Mary, did not think they were important. Jesus Christ lived obscurely for most of his life, and never travelled far. He was maligned and rejected by many, though he had done no wrong. And yet, billions of people now follow his teaching and find in him the guiding light for their lives. I am one of them because Christ’s example helps me see the value of doing small things with great love”. Not my words but those of our Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth in her 2016 Christmas Broadcast.



As some of you will know, each year I produce an Advent Calendar booklet with a reflection for each day in Advent and this year I have used a selection of extracts from the Queen’s broadcasts – a task that meant reading and watching all the Queen’s 69 Christmas Broadcasts, from her first one in 1952 (she didn’t do one in 1969 as a documentary on the Royal Family was shown on Christmas Day instead). One of the things that struck me as I watched them was how they changed over the years, not just because The Queen aged but also how less formal her manner and pronunciation became and also how, as the years went on, she became more open about herself and her personal Christian faith.

Christmas, as the Queen said, is the celebration of a very ordinary event, the birth of a child. On another level it is, as she goes on to say, the celebration of a very special event, the light of God coming into the world. But this light of God did not come in a blinding, dazzling way, but from, as the The Queen said, “the humblest of beginnings”. You could say like a candle flame rather than a floodlight, which reminds me of a modern carol by Graham Kendrick that goes like this:

*Like a candle flame flickering small in our darkness,
Uncreated light shines through infant eyes.
Stars and angels sing, yet the earth sleeps in shadows.
Can this tiny spark set a world on fire?
Yet his light shall shine from our lives,
Spirit blazing, as we touch the flame of his holy fire.*

More than once in her Christmas Broadcasts The Queen talks about the way ordinary people can make a difference. It's a theme she comes back to again and again over the years. In her 2015 broadcast The Queen spoke about Jesus's unchanging message of love and encouraged us to be thankful for the people who bring love and happiness into our lives and to look for ways of spreading that love to others whenever and wherever we can. She ended that broadcast with these words: "There's an old saying that 'it is better to light a candle than curse the darkness'".

There's something special about candlelight, a specialness that electric light doesn't have. Candlelight is a living thing, it moves and needs air, it can grow and spread and as such it reminds us of life; and also, it gives off warmth and so reminds us of love. Light, life and love, all things that God is and which we think of as coming into the world at Christmas. And just as candlelight can be shared so, too, we can share the light and life and love of God when we do small things with great love.

May each of us think of little ways we might make our world just a little bit brighter, this Christmas and always.

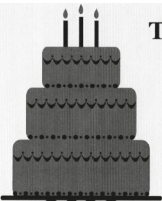

NATURE WATCH

Just a few weeks ago we were all wishing for rain, following the prolonged summer drought but, as the old warning goes, be careful what you wish for, and of course rain swept in from the Atlantic. For many parts of the country severe flooding was a major problem with some getting 75mm in twenty-four hours. Locally ponds have refilled, streams are running and with the continuing unseasonal, warm weather it has been more like spring than autumn. Leaf fall has been delayed and lengthened so that in mid-November many oaks had dropped their orangey, bronze leaves whilst others were still in the green. However, due to the persistent rain and the lack of cold sunny days, we have been denied one of the great joys of autumn, which for me, has always been the pleasurable activity of scuffing and kicking through drifts of fallen leaves on a walk through the woods. The warm weather has not only delayed leaf fall but has played tricks on many plants, some of which have flowered early. A friend told me he had crocuses poking through and we had two pots of narcissi both with leaves emerging. Some birds have also been showing signs of confusion, with blue tits inspecting bird boxes, as though they were looking for a nesting site. However, as is often the case, a cold snap will quickly bring things to a halt. In the third week of November cooler nights are now setting in and the birds around the feeding stations are really beginning to show they are fattening-up ready for the colder months ahead. Will we get snow?

Talking of feeding stations brings up the subject of the current outbreak of avian flu, which was first reported in China in 1997 and affects all birds. However, an American study has reported it mainly affects sea birds and poultry but ducks appear to be carriers and that song birds are not as badly affected because they carry a less virulent strain. The precautionary advice is to ensure all feeding areas and equipment are regularly cleaned to keep down the risk of spreading this disease.

In mid-November I had a call from Jean Bristow. Her conversation began with a mysterious question “What do you think I saw when I was walking in the garden today”. The answer was a pair of hawfinches. The hawfinch (*Coccothraustes coccothraustes*) is our largest finch and is related to the Chinese and Japanese grosbeaks. They are between 15-18cms in length, have a wingspan of between 28-33cms, with a strong head and large powerful, metallic looking beak, which they use for cracking the shells of cherries, sloes and plums. Their plumage is predominantly light brown with a black throat and eye patch and white on wings and tail feathers. Hawfinch are rare and, on the Red List and, although the south east is one of the UK hotspots, they are still difficult to find. They often pair-up for life and tend to be found around mixed woodland particularly if it contains hornbeam. Other recent reports included one from Yvonne and Tony Cooper who saw the white squirrel in Wasp Green Lane, which was first spotted last year. Yet another is that the National Trust is planning a further phase of felling ash trees affected by the die-back disease, which I believe has become more widespread this year perhaps due to increased susceptibility due to the summer drought. Thankfully saplings are already appearing in clearings and we still have our oaks, field maples and hornbeams.

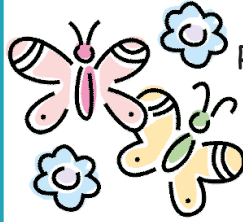

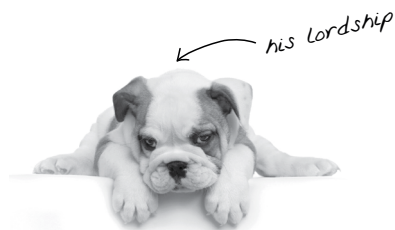

It cannot be denied that times are going to be difficult going forward with many services provided by principal authorities such as Tandridge District Council and Surrey County Council coming under severe constraints because of Government cutbacks due to the current financial crisis.

It may well be that some of these services matter to local communities and that Parish and Town Councils feel compelled to pick them up to make communities better and more sustainable. Grants from community organisations need to be considered and necessary financial assistance provided if certain criteria are met.

As we all know, inflation is higher than it has been for decades, costs are increasing exponentially and even small parishes like Outwood face increasing costs. It is with this in mind that the budgets will be set for the next financial year. The Council's reserves need to be built up in order to protect it from unknown and unplanned eventualities.

Just trying to prepare our residents for the inevitable increase in your local Parish Council tax. It will be considered carefully with all the above in mind.
