

### **CHURCH NEWS**

### **Rector's Ramblings**

This Christmas will be my last as Rector of the Windmill United Benefice. As I said last month my last service will be on Sunday 7th January (10am at St Mary the Virgin, Horne – everyone welcome!) and that means, as this is a joint December/January issue of the magazine, that this is my last Rector's Ramblings. Following my November Ramblings one of you emailed me, thanking me for my Ramblings and saying how they were *So open, non-judgemental and thoughtful, a simple reflection on the world that makes you stop at think.* I replied saying that's just how I wanted them to be! I would also like to add to that how much I have enjoyed writing to you each month and also hearing back from you, either by email or in person.



At heart, Christmas is the celebration of the birth of baby. In the Gospel of Luke, when the angels appear to the shepherds, they tell them: *This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.* But what sort of sign is a newborn baby? It's an amazing sign, because a newborn baby is such an amazing thing. You may or may not have held a very young baby, but over the years I have held a number them. Not just my children and grandchildren but also young babies I have baptised. And whenever I have done that I have a sense that to look on a newborn baby is to look on God, God in the form of a human child. To look on God because God is life, God is love and God is light, and a newborn child brings life and love and light into the world. And whether or not you have held a newborn baby, you were once a newborn baby yourself and when you were born you brought a little bit of God into the world. When we celebrate at Christmas the life, love and light of God coming into the world in a unique way in Jesus, we also celebrate your life and every life that comes into the world.

Whenever I've held a young baby I'm always struck by how delicate and fragile they areand that makes me think how delicate and fragile life is. And the message of Christmas reflects that. Luke's account of Christmas is full of angels and shepherds, songs of great joy and a peaceful child lying in a manger. Matthew's Gospel has wise men from the East being warned in a dream of the danger King Herod poses for the newborn child, Joseph being warned to flee for his family's life, taking the child and Mary as refugees into Egypt as Herod, realising he has been tricked, flies into a furious rage and orders the slaughter of all the little boys in Bethlehem. And so Matthew's account of Jesus' birth ends with a quote from the prophet Jeremiah: A sound was heard in Ramah, the sound of bitter weeping. Rachel weeping for her children.

# **CHURCH NEWS**

We're more used to Luke. It's the account most full of peace and joy – where everything works out all right. *No tears at Christmas* as my mother used to say to my sister and me. But children do cry – and adults cry. And the tears of Matthew's Gospel are just as much a part of the Christmas story as Luke's songs of joy. Because from the beginning, in the cry of a baby in a manger, to the end, in the cry of a man on a cross, the life and death of Jesus Christ, the word made flesh, illustrate the willingness of God to be vulnerable in order to share to the full both the joy and the sadness of what it means to be human.

And for me, as I approach retirement after 35 years of stipendiary ministry, it has been a privilege to share in the joys and sadnesses of the people I have worked among and I feel very blessed to have spent the last nine of them among all of you.














# **OUTWOOD WI**














### NATURE WATCH

he return of rain in late October continued through to mid-November, with some spells very heavy with strong winds, which did the usual seasonal pruning of dead tree branches but most importantly rehydrated the soil. Ditches started to flow, ponds refilled and the fungal kingdom must have breathed a sigh of relief and given four weeks of water they have responded and have begun to appear everywhere, such as the familiar Shaggy Inkcap (*Coprinus comatus*) aka Judges or Lawyers wig.



Gerald Sharp reported he had found two patches of edible mushrooms; recognised by their plain white caps, baby pink gills on the underside and the unmistakeable smell. I found a colony of honey fungus (Armillaria mellea) had suddenly sprung up of the edge of the lawn next to a shrub border that was last badly affected over thirty years ago. This fungus which attacks a wide range of trees and shrubs often in a very random way, has light-amber brown caps with darker brown flecks and can be found across the UK and northern Europe. Other species of armillaria are found around the world. One in Canada is estimated to be between 6-8000 years of age and covers an area of 10 sq. kilometres. The fungal kingdom arose one billion years ago, whereas plants arrived 500,000 years later. It is believed that there are approximately 4 million species and they act as the earths refuse service by feeding on detritus and breaking it down into its basic elements. They also produce enzymes, acids and other chemicals. Through their underground network of roots called mycelium some fungi (mycorrhizal) develop symbiotic relationships with plants, where mycelium burrow into their roots and supply the plants with water and nutrients and in return plants supply the fungi with sugars; without this relationship most plants and trees would not exist. Some fungi also have a mutually beneficial symbiotic relationship with algae which in turn creates lichens of which there are 1,800 in the UK and over 20,000 worldwide. Lichens fix nitrogen and breakdown rocks helping to create a stable soil structure.


Rainfall has also resulted in plenty of mole activity evidenced by the number of fresh molehills. I had a few that popped-up on the lawn so I quickly turned to the usual solution – calcium carbide - which produces plenty of smoke but causes no harm. Alas, two treatments failed and then I had the idea that moles would not like the smell of a dog. So, I scooped up some fresh dog poo and carefully placed it in the tunnels. Low and behold we've been clear of moles for over three weeks. Recently I've had a number of unusual reports. The first was from my son Andrew who was checking out a leaking roof only to find that part of the cause was squirrels that had chewed holes through the lead of a box gutter – not too good for the health of the squirrel. The second came from Alison Donald who said she had found a natterjack toad (*Epidalea calamitus*) in her garden. The natterjack is the rarest amphibian in the UK, generally found in sandy, coastal sites in the south east. They are distinguished by a yellow stripe down their backs, are smaller than the common toad and have a lifespan of up to fifteen years. The last report came from David Taylour, who helps me with the garden, and in a conversation about birds he mentioned that he used to have a local blackbird that could mimic the sound of a house alarm.

### Have your say on local policing as 'policing your community' roadshow returns

RESIDENTS will get the chance to have their say on policing in their local communities as Surrey Police and the Police and Crime Commissioner team up to hold a series of public engagement events over the next three months.

The 'Policing Your Community' events will take place until 29 January 2024 and offer residents the opportunity to put their questions about local policing to the Commissioner Lisa Townsend, Chief Constable Tim De Meyer and the Inspector responsible for local policing where they live.

New Chief Constable Tim De Meyer was appointed by the Commissioner in April and will talk about the current challenges and plans for Surrey Police.

The events throughout this winter will also take place ahead of the Commissioner's consultation on the amount that residents will contribute towards policing from next year's council tax, giving residents a chance to learn more about how their money is used both visibly - and behind the scenes - to boost crime fighting across Surrey.

For those that can't make it, additional virtual events will take place online for each borough and district from Monday 8 January to 29 January 2024. To see more information about registering for all events please see https://surrey-pcc.gov.uk/policing-your-community

Chief Constable Tim De Meyer said: "We want to provide the best possible policing service and it is extremely important that our residents are kept up to date. These events will enable us to speak to the public about current challenges and our plans for Surrey Police and are an opportunity for you to ask questions. It would be great to see as many of you there as possible."

The Parish Council will be setting its budget in the next month or so. And the next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on 3rd January 2024, when the budget will be approved and the precept for the coming year set.

In the mean time we would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.


