

# **ALAN'S AMBLINGS**

As we enter December, the busyness of preparing for Christmas is thrust upon us. There are cards to be written, presents bought, Christmas trees prepared, homes decorated and endless Christmas parties and dinners to attend. It can feel like a very hectic time of the year and by Christmas Day we are ready for a break!



The season of Advent which begins on 30th November gives us an opportunity to pause and reflect in the midst of all this frenetic activity. We often mark this countdown to Christmas by opening a window on our Advent Calendar or lighting a candle. Advent is a beautiful season in the Church's calendar and marks the beginning of a new year. We begin on Advent Sunday with our beautiful Candlelit Advent service at 4pm at St Mary's Horne and continue with a number of different Carol and Crib services throughout the Benefice which are highlighted elsewhere in the magazine. Do try and take time out from the Christmas rush to attend one of these special services in the run up to Christmas which I hope will give you spiritual refreshment and an opportunity to reflect on what Christmas is really all about.

During Advent we look back to the prophets especially Isaiah who not only foretold the birth of Christ but often spoke challenging words to those in authority warning of the need for justice and peace, words that are still very relevant today in our broken and divided world today. We also give thanks for Mary, the mother of our Lord whose willingness to say yes to the Angel Gabriel made everything possible and without whom there would be no birth to celebrate.

This year there will also be an opportunity to welcome Mary and Joseph and baby Jesus into your homes during Advent. I will be sending round a carved olive wood figurine which comes from the Holy Land and was made by Palestinian Christians in Bethlehem. There will be a candle to light, a prayer to say and a book to write in as well as information about where it was made. If anyone wants to receive the Holy Family into their homes as we journey with them to Bethlehem, please get in touch with me as soon as possible via the Benefice email or by phone so that I can allocate a slot for you. I am keen that as many families as possible across the Benefice will be able to welcome Mary, Joseph and Jesus into their homes as we prepare for Christmas

The other thing that I will be offering in the New Year during the season of Epiphany is the opportunity to bless your home at the beginning of the New Year. There is a very ancient tradition of marking homes with chalk and writing the letters CMB and the year over the door which means Christ bless this home in Latin. Again, if anyone would like to have their home blessed, please get in touch with me about this. The Epiphany blessings will begin on **Plough Sunday, 11th January** when I will also be a blessing a plough at Outwood Church and distributing seeds to be planted for the New Year

# **NATURE WATCH**

The importance of the many branches of science have over time been the driving force behind the increase in the sum of human knowledge, whether in the development of cures for diseases such as the personal vaccine to treat breast cancer, the invention of electricity or the better understanding of the environment and all life on the planet. At all levels it is science that has led the way. An excellent example of this is the recent discovery, by a team at Glasgow University, of the reason why some animals migrate or hibernate. They have pinpointed a single gene present in all mammals which sets the seasonal clock and must be switched on to initiate winter dormancy and which is mainly active in animals that live closer to the poles. This seasonal clock also triggers migration and in terms of the accuracy in reaching their destinations, birds also use a magnetic compass. Interestingly, the place to which different bird species migrate can in some cases be changed over time. The shy, elusive blackcap is a good example where the birds that spend their summers in northern Europe migrate to southern Europe for the winter. However, as an example of the way this behaviour can change evidence points to a number of the UK population staying here over the winter and they are joined by blackcaps that spend their summers in Germany.

The topsy-turvy weather this year continues to break the normal pattern. The first couple of weeks of November saw temperatures that were considerably higher than normal – more akin to October and then the appearance of sleet, snow and arctic winds on 19th of November. It was noticeable that in the three days before the cold spell arrived Yvonne noticed that our bird population seemed to have gone AWOL, all we saw were two or three crows and a magpie but then as soon as the cold weather struck the blue tits, robins and sparrows all returned to the feeders. The effect of the drought period resulted, as everyone knows, in the biggest crop of berries and fruits on trees and shrubs that we've seen for many a year. However, many of them have remained with their berries intact so much so that the branches of the pyracantha framing the front door and surround is absolutely packed with orange berries – just right for Christmas.

Yet another surprise came in the third week of November when I was passing the large patch of Butterbur (*Petasites hybridus*), aka winter heliotrope, on the bank close to Brightleigh Farm entrance, I spotted a number of flowers. The small flowers which are held on long stems are purple and pink and they are about two and a half months early as they normally flower in February. Butterbur gets its name from the old practice of using their large leaves to wrap butter. In the kingdom of fungi, the one I have seen most frequently this year has been the trooping fungus (*Infundibuliybe geotropa*). This a large creamy white fungus with a large flattish cap often six inches or more across, they can occasionally be seen as singles but much more often they appear in large circles on the site of the roots of dead trees - a good example can be seen on the righthand side of Rookery Hill down to Smallfield.



# Parish Council Budget Planning for 2026-2027

The Parish Council is currently undertaking its annual review and planning of the budget for the forthcoming financial year, 2026-2027. This process will determine the amount requested from Tandridge District Council to cover projected expenditure. The sum requested is known as the precept, and the Council will determine that figure after careful consideration of the budget.

# **Local Government Reorganisation**

The government has recently confirmed its intention to reorganise local councils within Surrey. The traditional two-tier system, which divides responsibilities between Surrey County Council and the various district or borough councils, will be replaced by two new unitary authorities: East Surrey Council and West Surrey Council.

# **Formation of East Surrey Council**

East Surrey Council will encompass the areas currently served by Elmbridge, Epsom & Ewell, Mole Valley, Reigate & Banstead, and Tandridge councils. This newly formed council will assume responsibility for all local services, including but not limited to economic support and development, housing, planning, waste management, education, roads, and social care.

There will be no Parish Council meeting scheduled for December. The Council's next meeting will take place on 6th January. Members of the community are encouraged to attend and participate in the discussions at the upcoming meeting.

# PARENT AND TODDLER GROUP


Are you interested in joining or helping to run a Parent and Toddler Group at the Lloyd Hall?



## **OUTWOOD EXTENSION PROJECT OPENING**

"In every walk with nature one receives far more than he seeks." — John Muir

The importance of access to nature and greenspaces and the benefits for mental wellbeing have been understood for many years. The resurfacing of the path on Outwood Common marks an important step towards improving access to nature for all visitors, whatever the season. The project has transformed a section of the common that was previously difficult to navigate for much of the year due to its heavy, clay-rich soils and persistent muddiness. Where once the route was often impassable during wet months, it now forms part of an all-weather loop that invites walkers, families and nature enthusiasts to explore the landscape year-round.

Outwood Common, with its mix of grassland, woodland edges, and rich biodiversity, has long been a valued local green space. However, the combination of frequent rainfall and poor drainage had rendered parts of the path almost unusable during autumn and winter. The new resurfacing work has addressed these issues sensitively, using materials that complement the natural setting while providing a stable and durable walking surface. The result is a route that balances environmental care with practical access needs, allowing more people to enjoy the beauty and tranquillity of the common without causing damage to the surrounding habitat.

Funding for the project was made possible through the generous support of Your Fund Surrey whose contribution helped turn community aspirations into reality. The works themselves were undertaken by Mike Butcher and his team, whose experience and craftsmanship ensured that the path was both functional and sympathetic to its rural context. A big thank you to all of the private doners for their contributions, to the fantastic National Trust volunteers and to Paul Howard, for without all of whom this project wouldn't have been possible.

This new loop is more than just an improved walking route—it represents a commitment to inclusive access to green spaces. At a time when the benefits of nature for physical and mental wellbeing are increasingly recognised, projects like this play a crucial role in fostering healthier, more connected communities. Being able to walk through the woods, listen to birdsong, and enjoy the changing seasons should not depend on the weather or one's mobility.

The resurfaced path at Outwood Common ensures that people of all ages and abilities can experience the restorative power of the natural world throughout the year. It stands as a reminder that even modest infrastructure improvements can have a lasting and meaningful impact—helping more people to "walk with nature," and to receive far more than they seek.

The path was opened on Wednesday 29th October 2025 by Tim Hall (Chair of Surrey County Council) and Dr Gillian Orrow.

November offered us a chance to remember all those who gave their lives in service to our country. I was honoured to join veterans, local volunteers, our emergency services, and Father Peter O'Connell in Godstone for a beautiful Remembrance Day service.

Whilst living connection to the World Wars may be fading, it's our duty to never forget the sacrifices our brave servicemen and women made so our nation could triumph in the face of tyranny. We will always remember them.

It's been a remarkable year for my family with the birth of my son, but the journey was not straightforward; becoming a mother left me in a medical coma and almost killed me. I'm so grateful to the brilliant doctors and nurses who saved my life. My husband and I sat down on the This Morning sofa a few weeks ago to tell our story – I have shared the clip on my Facebook page.

Back to the constituency, our farmers make sure we have brilliant British food, but it's often bloody hard work – so it was great to sit down with local farmers and the NFU recently. Farms are not just beautiful fields or places for the Government to put solar farms; they provide food security, and many have been in the same hands for generations. The Government's intent in destroying our rural way of life through their Family Farm Tax is wrong and based on an ignorance of how farm finances actually work. The Conservatives will back our farmers and scrap this pernicious tax if we win the next election.

At the meeting we also discussed the soaring numbers of unauthorised traveller sites in Tandridge. These sites are being set up on Green Belt land without planning permission, and like locals I'm becoming increasingly frustrated. I met with Surrey Police and Tandridge Council and am working with colleagues in Westminster to press for national change. I organised a letter to the Home Secretary calling for a task force to support local councils in tackling illegal encampments. I will always act to protect our countryside and ensure fairness for all residents.

We also received confirmation that Surrey County Council and all district and borough councils in Surrey will be abolished and replaced with two unitary authorities – East Surrey Council and West Surrey Council. Next year's May council elections will take place. My main concern has been the shadow of other councils' debt. When I wrote to the Government in May, I made clear East Surrey residents should not pick up the bill for towns they don't live in, left by councillors they did not elect. Whilst some debt will be written off, billions remain, and I will continue to press Ministers to make sure any debt burden incurred elsewhere in the county is not placed on the residents of East Surrey.

As I wrap up this month's update, I would like to wish you all a very merry Christmas and a happy new year, and to thank you for the many wonderful conversations I've had with constituents on the doorsteps, in the community and in my many surgeries throughout 2025. The Knepp Project and Brightleigh Farm: a collaboration.


