

IAN FROW RIP



The sad loss of a great friend and staunch Outwoodian.

It is with great sadness that we record Ian's death. He and Enid moved to Outwood in 1966 and Ian has served this village well in so many ways, as Chairman of the Parish Council, member and supporter of Outwood Cricket Club and the Royal British Legion, the Outwood Wheelers Cycling Club, driver of the Rotary bus and for the Orpheus Centre, and so much more.

Ian grew up in Streatham and was evacuated with his mother to Herne Bay during the War. After St Bernard's Primary school he attended Battersea Grammar and also became head Chorister at St Margaret the Queen, Streatham Hill.

His career was totally focussed on flying and there are very few flight deck crew alive today who do not instantly recognise his name. He accomplished an incredible 20,253 flying hours in his lifetime. Ian started gliding in open cockpits at the age of 15 which led to an RAF scholarship and training on piston Provosts aged 18, upgrading to De Havilland Vampires in 1957. The Vampire was only the second RAF jet fighter and the first to exceed 500mph. It was made of wood and metal with no ejector seat!

After leaving the RAF, Ian was recruited by BOAC where he rose through the ranks to the position of Chief Training Officer. He and Enid met during their BOAC days and married and moved to the house in Outwood in which they had a son, Neil and have lived very happily for the rest of Ian's life. He got the greatest joy from their granddaughter Izzy on whom he doted.

Captain Ian Frow became Chairman of the Concorde Evaluation Team and flew the best and fastest version of the Concorde series during this time.

For the rest of his career he flew BA 747s becoming a renowned training captain. He was obliged under rules to retire from BA at 55 and joined Virgin as Flight Technical and Development Manager.

On 'retirement' Ian was appointed Chief Editor of the BALPA journal 'The Log' and he continued until recently to compose his regular spot 'Rocking chair' in which he related amusing stories but also addressed serious and sometimes contentious topics without fear or favour. He had a natural ability to write and a dry and rather Goon/Summer Wine like eclectic sense of humour. He wrote a thick tome setting out the rules for the eccentric club which he named 'The Outwood Bicycycle Wheelers'

We shall all miss you Ian but thank you for the warm memories.

Rector's Ramblings

Christmas seems a long time ago now. In the shops it feels as if Christmas ends on Boxing Day, but in the church's calendar it's just beginning then. The actual season of Christmas has 12 days (as I'm sure you know from the carol!), followed by the season of Epiphany which begins on 6th January and lasts until 2nd February, making the combined Christmas and Epiphany season last a total of 40 days. The 40 days come from the Gospel of Luke where we read that it was after this length of time that Mary and Joseph went up to the temple at Jerusalem and Simeon proclaimed the infant Jesus as 'a light to lighten the Gentiles', a time in church that we



call Candlemas and which we tend to celebrate on the nearest Sunday before 2^{nd} February, which this year is 30^{th} January. So by the time you read this, whichever way you look at it, Christmas will be over!

Candlemas is, in a way, a last look at Christmas, and I'd like to have a last look at Christmas in this letter and take you back to an assembly I did last month for Burstow school. I wasn't actually in school because of the virus, so recorded it at home for them to watch in school. I began by showing them a gold bar – not real gold, I explained, as that would be worth £50,000 or so! But, I said, its value lay in the fact that it always stayed shiny and could be used to make beautiful jewellery and other special things. Then I showed them some frankincense and told them it is a form of tree resin which gives off a lovely smell when burnt. I lit some which soon filled the room with smoke and wonderful smell. I then explained that Myrrh is also a tree resin that can also be distilled to form an oil. I put some drops of myrrh oil into an oil burner. I said it was a shame that they couldn't actually smell the aromas but that burning incense and using fragrant smelling myrrh was a way of making or showing that a person or place was special.

Then I went on to tell them that it's not just expensive or exotic things like gold, frankincense or myrrh that are special. Ordinary, everyday things can be special too. I said how on the morning I was recording the assembly, there was a beautiful frost which had made the grass glisten and the cobwebs sparkle and how the night before there had been a beautifully clear starry night. And as I write this letter, sat at my desk, I look out on wonderful late winter sunlight and the gleaming rosehips outside my study window.

But I told the school, we have to take time to notice these things. It's all too easy to miss them unless we take time to pause for a moment and to look, really look, to stand and stare as it were. And on that note, I finished with a poem, which may well be familiar to you and you may also recognise as one of my favourites. So here it is for you too, it's called Leisure by W.H. Davies:

What is this life if, full of care,
We have no time to stand and stare?No time to stand beneath the boughs
And stare as long as sheep or cows:
No time to see, when woods we pass,
Where squirrels hide their nuts in grass:
No time to see, in broad daylight,
Streams full of stars, like skies at night:
No time to turn at Beauty's glance,
And watch her feet, how they can dance:
No time to wait till her mouth can
Enrich that smile her eyes began?
A poor life this if, full of care,
We have no time to stand and stare.



NATURE WATCH

he mild, wet weather of December continued into the new year and on the way a record was set for the highest ever recorded temperature in England and Wales on 31st December with 16.5°C at Bala in North Wales. The first two weeks of January produced a few overnight frosts but mild conditions prevailed, which resulted in many flowers being in bloom well in advance of their normal time. Sylvia Maiklem reported seeing primroses in bloom in late December and Jane Weston, with her Horticultural Society hat on, emailed members on 6th January with a list of nineteen plants flowering in her garden. Many of us will have found some of the listed flowers in our own gardens and likely others that were either unusual or tucked away in protected spots. We had a winter flowering honeysuckle and pale pink cherry tree that was putting on a real show but our budding narcissi were still one or two weeks behind and if temperatures suddenly drop then it could be another month before we can enjoy that sweet smelling harbinger of spring. However, it was not just the flora, this warmer than average weather also affected animal behaviour with reports of bats emerging too early from hibernation and starving due to the lack of insects that make up their normal food supply. Meanwhile, squirrels, used to breaking their hibernation when conditions are mild, have been busy falling back on their stores of acorns or foraging in the leaf litter. The white squirrel, reported in December, has become quite a celebrity with regular appearances on both sides of Wasp Green Lane. It has also been noticeable that birds are showing signs of early nesting with blue tits inspecting and cleaning bird boxes and pigeons exhibiting mating behaviour.

As a child I recall being told to avoid eating berries on trees and shrubs in the countryside. Many berries are edible but the warnings were clear, "unless you are sure about them, don't eat them". We taught the same lessons to our children. Our three-year-old daughter Elaine, who misheard, always called a certain wayside flower, "deadly lampshades" (nightshade) - a name which stuck. This advice certainly applied to the bright red fruit of yew trees that had a scary reputation and rightly so. All parts of the yew are poisonous with the exception of the bright red covering of the seed, called an aril, which is sweet and fleshy and regularly eaten by birds, particularly thrushes, which distribute the seeds in their droppings.

The yew (Taxus baccata), aka the common or English yew, commonly found in churchyards and used to make battle winning longbows, can be found across Europe. It is a medium sized tree and prefers calcareous downland soils such as those found on the southern slopes of Box Hill near Dorking. The yew has many uses. As gardeners know it makes good hedges, is good for topiary and can be cut back and will still sprout again from old wood. It is used for furniture and the production of a cancer drug. Also, such was the toxic reputation of yew that in ancient Greece it was used to commit suicide. Yew trees normally live to between 300 – 600 years, although there are a number of much older specimens, some estimated to be between 2 and 3000 years, making them the oldest trees in Europe. The oldest I've seen was in the graveyard of the 14th century church of St Cuthbert at Widworthy, near Honiton in Devon, which was just over 4.5 metres in girth.




OUTWOOD PARISH COUNCIL
