BRYAN BETTISON RETIRES

Bryan Bettison is a friendly face well known to many of us in Outwood as our helpful, cheery and positive postman. Sadly, Bryan is retiring in late February but his great contribution to the community is hugely appreciated and will not be forgotten.

Growing up locally in Reigate, Bryan has fond memories of his childhood which he spent playing with his pet dogs and having many paper rounds to do before school. He would not describe his work as a postman to be a 'natural calling' but more as something that fell into place over time due to his enjoyment of meeting people and his considerate nature.

Bryan joined the Royal Mail 47 years ago on the 28th June 1976 and began his postal duties working in the Redhill office as well as delivering post to Betchworth where he worked for seven years. In his time as a postman for Betchworth, Bryan was responsible for two delivery routes by van and one by bike.



However in the early 80s, Bryan decided to 'go back inside' to support his growing family and went back full time to the Redhill office where he sorted letters, directed package distribution and worked in the 'book room' where he managed staff hours. Then, he began delivering to Outwood and started his rounds on the 11th September 2011.

Bryan says the only downside to his job is when the weather is cold, wet and windy – the worst of combinations! He says it is 'hard to not let the weather get you down' when walking from house to house when it is truly miserable outside.

Bryan begins his morning at six when his alarm goes off then he heads into the Redhill Office where he sorts letters for all of us in Outwood and prepares them for the individual households. He is then ready to start his journey off and begin delivering our post.

The Hollywood-movie stereotype of posties having to fend off terrifyingly frightening dogs while delivering has never happened to Bryan as he has always loved dogs ever since being a young boy growing up in Reigate.

Bryan's plans for retirement are not set in stone but he will 'take each day as it comes' which is his mantra in life and in his work. He plans to spend as much time as he can with his nine grandchildren and perhaps get a part time job to keep himself busy.


From all of us in Outwood, goodbye Bryan and thank you for your incredible service to us! We will miss you greatly.

CHURCH NEWS

BISHOP'S BURBLINGS

At the service for Epiphany held on Sunday 7th January, at St Mary the Virgin, Horne, we sadly said our thankyou's and farewells to Nicholas and Judith Calver after Nicholas' 9 years of service as Rector of the Windmill United Benefice, and we continue to pray for them and to wish them both well in their retirement in the beautiful Kent countryside.



As Nicholas observed in the months running up to his retirement, there is a season for everything, a beginning and an ending. Quoting from the Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes, he reminded us that "for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven", noting that the time was now right for him, after 35 years of stipendiary ministry, to seek new challenges and new beginnings - the ending of one chapter and the beginning of a new chapter in the lives of Nicholas and Judith.

And so, as one chapter closes in the life of the Windmill United Benefice and the Parishes of St Bartholomew Burstow, St Mary the Virgin Horne, and St John the Baptist Outwood, a new one opens. For now the Benefice begins the task of finding a replacement Rector - no easy task that to replace Nicholas's sensitive, humble and thoughtful service, and Judith's excellent administrative and supportive talents!

This will involve preparing a Parish Profile - a document which will be sent to prospective applicants providing the history and details of the churches of the Benefice as well as the parishes and surrounding villages and area -, agreeing a "person profile" and a "job description", in collaboration with the Diocese of Southwark and the appropriate church Patrons.

In the meantime, we enter a period of Interregnum, or Vacancy, as the aforementioned necessary administrative work is undertaken in order to be able finally to advertise for the role of the new Rector, and hopefully interview potential candidates at the end of April. Dependent upon the circumstances of the successful applicant there may be a further period of time whilst the newly appointed Rector-in-waiting leaves their current post and makes their necessary preparations to move into the Rectory here in Smallfield.

During this time of Interregnum, the Wardens of the three churches are tasked by the Bishop with running the Benefice as on his behalf, overseen and assisted by the Archdeacon of Reigate, The Venerable Moira Astin.

Together with Rev'd Charles Sargent, also an existing self-supporting minister licensed to the Benefice, he and I hope to be able to continue as much as possible with the current schedule of services at each of the churches, and to provide any necessary pastoral support to the community for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals.

We are planning to hold Lent Study Groups during February and March, on a Monday evening at 7.30 and Wednesday afternoons at 2pm at the Smallfield Church Hall commencing 19th February,

In addition, we are launching a monthly prayer meeting, again on a Monday evening and Wednesday afternoon in the Smallfield Church Hall. The first meeting is on Wednesday 31st January at 2pm.

Everyone is very welcome to join with us.

Like all new beginnings, there is the sense of the unknown as we venture forward, but, there is also the knowledge that like the seasons, the darkness of Winter will soon turn to lighter days with the new life and hope of Spring bringing with it the promise of a new creation and a new beginning. Then comes the Summer when we reap the benefits of the earlier hard work of sowing the seed and preparing the ground.

Our hope is that our 'harvest' later in the year will be a new Rector to lead us onto fresh pastures and new journeys.

We will of course continue to keep you updated with progress in the Benefice as we start our new season of Vacancy, and continue with our preparations for our fresh beginnings with our new Rector.

On behalf of the Windmill United Benefice I hope that you enjoyed a peaceful and joyful Christmas, and wish you every blessing for the new year of 2024! With love and prayers



NATURE WATCH

he new year signalled a change in the weather, from almost continuous rain to a jump in barometric pressure, blue, sunlit skies, plummeting temperatures, freezing conditions both night and day and a dusting of snow, until the fourth week of January, when rain returned in the form of storm Isha. Despite the yo-yoing of the weather, many garden plants were early into


flower providing much needed relief to the darker days, such as a patch of snowdrops with yellow aconites showing colour reported by Mary Baldock in the first week of January. In our garden the winter flowering cherry was in blossom over the Christmas period. In early January, the creamy white flowers of sweet box (Sarcocca confusa) were scenting the air with vanilla, and white and dark-red hellebores were opening their rose-like flowers but, unlike Mary, our snowdrops didn't start showing for another two weeks. Meanwhile, away from home the colour came from the vellow flowers of gorse on Outwood common and the lilac edged white flowers of the common butterbur (Petasites hybridus) with patches along Millers Lane, particularly near Brightleigh Farm. Butterbur is a member of the sunflower family and has traditionally been used in folk medicine as a treatment for flu, fever, migraine, asthma and allergies. More recent scientific studies have shown that it contains many chemicals some of which have proven medical uses.

In mid-December came a report from Julie Biddles who said, she thought she was going mad when she saw a pair of white-tailed eagles on Rookery Hill near Normans Corner and a second sighting near the same spot just a day later. She first reported seeing a white-tailed eagle aka fish eagle at a bird reserve in the Arun valley (March 2023 issue of Outwood News) but it was a real surprise to see them in Outwood. However, sightings have been recorded in many places across the south east including Redhill and Coulsdon and a recently tagged bird was tracked from the Isle of Wight. One morning it flew in an easterly direction across Sussex and Kent and in a few hours reached the Isle of Sheppey before turning back. What were fish eagles doing inland? The answer appears to be that white tailed sea eagles are attracted to rubbish dumps such as the one at Etherington's on Rookery Hill. A further inland sighting at Bookham Common came to light in a conversation I had with Ian Swinney on New Year's Day, which seemed to confirm this behaviour when he mentioned that there was a council rubbish tip in the vicinity. Interestingly, Ian, son-in-law of Mary and the late David Baldock, had been the National Trust's area ranger for Bookham Common in Surrey and had retired just the day before - 31 December - after serving fifty years but it was a few days later before I discovered that he had received an award of a BEM – Medallist of the order of the British Empire - in the New Year's Honours list. Congratulations to Ian.


Two other reports came from Gerald Sharpe. The first was the sighting of a white squirrel that has been spotted a few times in the woodland near the Outwood butchers. The second was of an Egyptian Goose on Gaines' Farm to the west of Prince of Wales Road. The Egyptian Goose was introduced to UK from North Africa in 17C as an ornamental bird with its light-fawn speckled brown and grey colouring and red legs. It is in fact a duck and was named due to its plump body and its in-flight silhouette.
