

### **Rector's Ramblings**

Christmas seems a long time ago now. It's amazing how time flies! In the shops it seems like Christmas ends on Boxing Day, but in the church's calendar it's just beginning then. It doesn't properly end until 40 days after Christmas on 2<sup>nd</sup> February at Candlemas, which marks the time when, according to the Gospel of Luke, Mary and Joseph went up to the temple at Jerusalem and Simeon proclaimed the infant Jesus as 'a light to lighten the Gentiles'.



I say properly end because the actual season of Christmas has 12 days (as I'm sure you know from the carol), followed by the season of Epiphany which begins on 6<sup>th</sup> January. This marks the visit of the wise men with their gifts for the newborn babe. As foreigners from afar, they represent the Gentiles (the non-Jewish races of the world) and so the 40 days of Christmas and Epiphany are all about celebrating Jesus as light of the whole world.

I was talking about this in an assembly I did last month in Burstow school. I started by asking the children what they got for Christmas and then asked them if they knew what presents Jesus had received when he was born. I was surprised how many of them put their hands up and I went on to talk about gold, frankincense and myrrh. Each of these gifts, I explained, were very expensive and valuable things: gold, a precious metal that always stayed shiny, and frankincense and myrrh, precious tree resins that not only smell nice when burnt or turned into oils but also have medicinal and healing properties.

I then talked about the wise men who brought the gifts and how they had been led by the star to Jesus. Though the carol calls them kings, the Bible refers to them as *magi*, from which we get our word magician. However, *magi* didn't pull rabbits out of hats or saw their assistants in half. They were learned men who watched the stars and understood events in the light of their observations – a mixture both of what we would now call astrology and astronomy.

I said how the wise men would have travelled by camel across deserts which led to me talking about my time travelling with camels in the Sinai desert, something which I've spoken to them about before, and something I've previously written about in my letter here. I talked about how I too, like the wise men, had been a desert star-gazer, particularly aware each night as I went to sleep on the sand of the stars of the Plough above me, stars which are part of the constellation *Ursa Major*, the Great Bear.

I then showed them a picture of a bear walking in the stars that I'd taken with me, one which usually hangs above my desk and is above me now as I write. I told them that it had been given to me by my daughter Sarah because she knew of my love of the stars and of my time in the desert and how the fact that she had given me the picture made it special for me. I finished by putting up on the screen some words I'd written and asked the children to think about them: The best gifts are the people who give them to us. Think again about what you got for Christmas, I said to them, and then think who gave it to you, and remember: the best gifts are the people who love and care for us.

And that's what I'd like to say to you, too.



# NATURE WATCH

The weather during the last two weeks of December simply slipped past almost unnoticed, just day after day of grey, cloudy and unremarkable conditions. There were no heavy frosts nor thick fogs and, although mild, there was little or no sunshine that is until New Year's day when, as if in celebration, a white deadnettle (Lamium album), tucked under the hawthorn hedge by the gate, sprung into flower. Then over the wall in the corner of the garden were even more flowers. First the winter flowering cherry (Prunus subhirtella autumnalis) sprinkled with pale, pinkish white flowers, under which were the sweet smelling, white flowers of the winter honeysuckle (Lonicera fragrantisima), the vanilla spiced, cream coloured, spiky flowers of winter box (Sarcocca confusa), pink, white and dark red hellebores, a single snow drop, and the pink and purple flushed bloom of a cyclamen coum. In the shrub border a statuesque mahonia was decorated with bright yellow cones of flowers which acted as a magnet to the local blue tit population that spent most of their waking hours feeding on the pollen and nectar and in passing creating a carpet of yellow petals on the ground below that provided a perfect background for the buds of Erysimum Bowles Purple, which were beginning to break. Meanwhile out in the woodland, even though it was just weeks since they dropped their leaves, the horse chestnut's sticky buds seemed to be starting to swell. The mild conditions and the imperceptible increase in daylight hours since the winter solstice on 21st December (2minutes 7 seconds per day) may have also encouraged birds such as ring doves to start collecting twigs - but beware the false dawn.

Over the last three years a small team of National Trust Volunteers have been conducting a survey of trees across the Harewoods Estate as part of a national audit set up by the Woodland Trust and supported by the National Trust. It is only when walking the ground and measuring the girth of the trunks at chest height, that you begin to get a real idea of just how many trees we have around us, the number of species and the ages of many of the ancient specimens such as oaks with girths of five to six metres. In Outwood our commonest trees are oaks, ash and hornbeam with hazel and holly in the under-storey. Then, dependent on soil type and condition, certain species predominate such the wild cherries or geans in Hornecourt Wood. Then there are the willows and alders on more waterlogged land, along ditches and around the many ponds. In addition we have a number of more unusual species one of which we recorded recently. This tree was a black poplar (Populus nigra), which once was quite common, however, over the last two hundred years their numbers have declined substantially and it is estimated that there are now roughly 2,500 trees remaining mostly in the south and east of England and the situation is similar in Europe. The decline is believed to be due to drainage of farmland, hybridisation with other species of poplar and shortage of female trees. The black poplar is a large tree of flood plains and ditch-lines where it grows to between 20 and 30 metres and is deciduous with triangular shaped leaves. It is dioecious and both the male and female trees need to be fairly close together because they are wind pollinated. The timber was used for floorboards, clogs, matchsticks, and arrows like those found on the Henry VIII's flagship the Mary Rose.

#### JANUARY MEETING

This month is already running away with us, and our first WI meeting of the year was buzzing with a full Lloyd Hall sharing good wishes and planning for 2019 activities. Our treasurer was bombarded by annual subscription envelopes, as members showed appreciation for the fantastic value offered by the camaraderie and learning that are central to our organisation. We have a full schedule of interesting speakers arranged for this year's meetings and the monthly clubs continue to enjoy shared activities: book appreciation; needlework of all types; play reading; films; mah jong. Lists of possible daytrips were also circulated as we discussed the merits of various gardens, houses, theatre productions and exhibitions. We certainly have a lot to look forward to in 2019!

A vote was taken on the six topics suggested by the national WI organisation as areas for us to take action on this year. These resolutions varied from female health to local services to ecological issues. The topic selected by our members was centred on improving plant bio security in the UK, calling for a comprehensive certification scheme to be introduced by the government.

Supporting both the local community and the worldwide community will always be part of our remit. It was a real pleasure to hear read aloud the letter we had received from the support team in Romania to whom, before Christmas, we had posted a parcel of handmade blankets and clothes as well as helpful tools. Their plight is desperate and we shall continue to support in whatever way we can. In contrast, several ladies left the meeting with large bags full of envelopes from which the stamps must be cut; the proceeds from the recycling of these will go towards the Canine Partners organisation.

It was also thanks to a donation we made last year to the Queen Victoria Hospital that we were able to welcome our speaker, Jacqueline Packer, from the Clinical Quality Department there. The money we donated will be going towards supporting the medical equipment and research at the hospital. Jacqueline outlined the origins of the hospital from its inception in 1863 as a local cottage hospital, its move to present location in 1936, and its renowned work with damaged soldiers from the world wars. East Grinstead was known as "the town that does not stare" and service personnel with horrific facial disfigurements were able to move around freely. Today the pioneering staff are still renowned for their ground-breaking work in facial surgery, made necessary by cancer and accidental injury. We were fascinated to hear about the latest developing techniques involving nerve grafts to the face which are carried out without any cutting or scarring. Outstanding results are achieved for children also in this field. Another specialist area of the hospital is successful breast reconstructions after cancer treatment. Jacqueline spoke with great pride about the awe-inspiring work done by her team at Queen Victoria Hospital.

As you can see from all of the above, our meetings are far from boring, so do come and join us! Our next meeting will be on Tuesday 5th February: it will be a birthday tea celebration and Caroline Durance will be telling us about her memorable year as mayoress.

# **OUTWOOD PARISH COUNCIL**

#### **JANUARY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

**Tandridge District Councillor (Cllr) Kevin Bourne** gave us an update on the churchyard extension which should be satisfactorily completed, later this month.

**Beechfield planning** – OPC CIIr Gosling asked what more has been done with regard to this matter. CIIr Bourne promised to follow it up and report back.

**National Trust** – Bellwether Lane footpath to be repaired shortly by the volunteers. The large church Christmas tree was donated by the NT and came from Horne Court Wood. Keep a look out for the reindeer walk in the woods.

**Planning** -- Ryall and Edwards / Tone Sawmills development. Cllr Bourne advised the enforcement notes are being drafted. Pleased report any concerns about Tone/Media Structures/Austen Lewis vehicles in the village, or entering and leaving the site in a dangerous manner to the Parish clerk.

**Training** – Cllr Gosling reported back from the SALC conference on the 15th of November. There was some discussion about the committee not being representative as it is made up of men but that 40% of Councillors attending were women.

**Annual Village Meeting on 1st April** – We will have a speaker from Wellbeing and might also have a representative from a service dealing with domestic abuse. Watch this space.

**Law and order** – Reports of unwanted door to door sales in Smallfield and Nutfield. Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator, Jane Howard to be alerted.

The Lloyd Hall Management Committee (LHMC) – Cllr Gosling advised the build is now complete and all build and landscaping paid for. Bookings of 5 weddings this year and 1, so far, for next year. OPC letter to LHMC re parking received a response from LH chair advising they don't have money for it and want to build up a reserve. 2019 funds won't cover parking and they can't defend this sort of spend. Fundraising opportunities might require a representative from each LH and OPC to organise events and research grants. Car parking will be a separate OPC agenda item. LHMC AGM is on Friday 18th of January.

**Aviation and transport** – Ian Frow & Cllr Wyer went to the AGM of the Noise Management Board. It's about accepting that planes make noise. There are fourteen members on the committee, which include four seats representing the complainant groups which doesn't really **work**. Suggestion that the committee be restructured to include affected Parish Councils. The next airport related meeting is 'Gatwick airspace change' – Ian will report back. The recent Redhill Aerodrome Consultative Committee meeting was cancelled. Next meeting is in April.

**Community Matters** – Cllr Yeldham advised the church repairs are nearly there and they are hoped to be completed by the end of January.

Your Parish Councillors are up for election this year so if you want to make a difference and get more involved in village life why not consider standing for election. If you are interested or would like more information, please let the Parish Clerk or any of the councillors know, or come along to the next meeting on 12th February.
