Rector's Ramblings

July brings us what has become known as "Freedom Day". On 19th July (postponed from 21st June) we will, if all goes to plan (famous last words!), be free of the Covid restrictions, the rules and regulations that have governed our lives for so long now. I wonder how you feel about that?

And you might wonder what the difference between a rule and a regulation is! If you look in the dictionary the answer is not much – if anything. They both come from the same Latin word *regula* meaning a rule. We associate rules and regulations with a list of dos and don'ts and we are very familiar with the ones that have



governed us over the last 18 months. Such rules and regulations have formed the framework of the three lockdowns we have been through and have in so many ways curtailed our freedom to do so many of the things that we were used to doing. No wonder the day has become known as Freedom Day.

But let's think a little more broadly about freedom and what it means to us – specifically what it means to us in a spiritual sense. There's a prayer in the Book of Common Prayer (it's the second collect in Morning Prayer) that begins like this:

O God, who art the author of peace and lover of concord, in knowledge of whom standeth our eternal life, whose service is perfect freedom.

I've always liked that prayer and always remember my father saying it in church. As a boy it amused me that God should be such a fan of a supersonic aircraft! But leaving concord and Concorde aside, the truth that a life lived in the service of God brings freedom is an important truth to reflect on. And when I say 'a live lived in the service of God', I'm not simply referring to those who have made the religious life their vocation, people such as monks and nuns and clergy like me, but to each and every one of us, however religious or unreligious we may think ourselves to be.

I mentioned earlier the Latin word *regula*. In a monastic or convent setting it is used to describe the rule of a religious order, but that sort of rule is not about having to obey a long list of dos and don'ts. It is not about regulations but about a way of regulating your life. It is not about rules but about using a rule (in the sense of a ruler) to measure your life by. And regulating and measuring our lives is something that each and every one of us needs to do to live our lives to their full potential.

So whatever your thoughts are about Freedom Day – maybe it can't come soon enough for you or maybe you feel a little bit anxious about it – perhaps you could think of it not just as a time when rules and regulations set by the government are lifted but also as a time to think about how your life is regulated and measured. A time to take stock, a time to reflect on all that you personally and all of us as a local community, nation and world have been through. A time to ask yourself: Am I living my life in the best way I am able?

There's a modern paraphrase of Psalm 23 that uses the image of a pacemaker to illustrate what I've been talking about. I like the image of a pacemaker – whether that's a medical device to keep the heart beating as it should or in the sporting world a person who makes sure the race is run at the right speed. You might like to use this version of Psalm 23 to help you reflect on how your life is measured and regulated, so here it is:

The Lord is my pacemaker - I shall not rush.

He makes me stop and rest for quiet intervals:

He provides me with images of stillness,

Which restore my serenity.

He leads me in ways of efficiency

Through calmness of mind, and His guidance is peace.

Even though I have a great many things

To accomplish each day, I will not fret - for His Presence is here:

His timelessness, His importance will keep me in balance.



WHAT GOES IN YOUR RUBBISH BIN

We collect household rubbish which cannot be recycled, every other week. The rubbish must be in green council bin bags or in the black council wheeled rubbish bin. Put the bin/bags at the edge of your property by 6am on your rubbish collection day. We will not collect general household rubbish if it is presented in your recycling bin.

There shouldn't be much left after you have recycled your food waste, all the items that can go in your blue lidded recycling bin and any textiles, small electrical items and batteries.

WHAT YOU CAN PUT IN YOUR BLACK WHEELED RUBBISH BIN

Bubble wrap.

Clina film.

Coat hangers (metal and plastic).

Crisp packets and other confectionary packaging such as chocolate and biscuit wrappers.

Expanded polystyrene.

Nappies.

Pet litter (max 10kg weight).

Sanitary products.

Wet/used kitchen paper, tissues and wipes.

WHAT YOU CAN'T PUT IN YOUR BLACK WHEELED RUBBISH BIN

Batteries.

Bricks and rubble.

Building waste such as plasterboard, fibreglass and tiles.

Carpet

Electrical items.

Garden waste, soil..

Gas canisters and helium bottles.

Hot ash (it can go in once cooled).

Large items such as furniture.

Sharp items or broken glass unless it is well wrapped. Please also put a note on the bin/bag warning the collectors.

NATURE WATCH

re are all aware of how the weather conditions affect life in general however, particularly obvious are the effects on plant life. After an atrocious April and most of May the weather god suddenly awoke and as if by magic, the daily clouds, wind, rain and low temperatures vanished to be replaced by cerulean skies and temperatures that rose to the mid twenties and higher, giving us at last our first taste of proper summer weather. The plant world just sprung into overdrive, whether garden or countryside. Grasses, wild flowers, shrubs and trees seemed to become rocket propelled as their growth accelerated as a catch up mechanism following a near six week delay compared with a normal year. Grasses, which had remained very short seemed to triple in height in just three weeks and by the third week of June will be about ready for haymaking. By late May swathes of the flat, white corymbs/flower-heads of cow parsley aka Queen Anne's lace were lining every footpath and bridleway around the village. Another plant with white corymbs is wild carrot (Daucus carota) and whilst not plentiful locally there is a fifteen metre stretch of it along a nearby hedge-line in the back fields. These fields also provide an excellent snapshot of the seasonal range of wild flowers with large patches of both the minute, yellow flowers of black medick, white and red clover, purple flowered tufted vetch, bright pink common vetch, the strong yellow of the meadow vetchling and in sheltered spots the delightful pink flower-heads of the common spotted orchid (Dactylorhiza fuschii). By the middle of june, dog daisies burst tnto



bloom and took centre stage, lining many of our lanes, like the ribbon of flowers outside Gerald Sharp's home in Wasp Green Lane (see left)and the mini wildflower meadow opposite The Castle. One little gem that has appeared this year in larger numbers than I ever remember before is the grass vetchling (*Lathyrus nissolia*) aka the Crimson Slipper. As the nickname suggests, it is a real beauty. The bright, crimson, 5 millimetre flowers that have the appearance of a miniature sweet pea, are held on slender, hair-like filaments emerging from the stems of what seem to be ordinary fine grass. In a normal year the flowers are scattered through the sward and initially seem difficult to find but the eye quickly learns to spot them. The individual flowers are short lived and if picked quickly shrivel to be replaced by miniature pea pods with, I've counted, as many as

eighteen seeds. As soon as the temperatures started to rise and the sun appeared so did the damsel flies, both azure blue and green, busily flying low above ponds and touching down briefly to lay eggs. Meanwhile butterflies have started to appear with peacocks, small blues, and I spotted my first painted lady on Monday 14th June - it was amazing to think that this delicate creature had flown all the way from North Africa.

Reports this month include one from Grant MacDonald who sent photographs of a poplar hawk moth he had spotted in the garden (see right). Another came from Ann Hooper Smith together with a photograph of a 35cms specimen of a slow worm she spotted near Hook House Farm plus news that there was a good crop of the common spotted orchids on the common. It is great to get so many reports of the natural world from villagers because it gives a much broader view of the riches around us. Thank you all.

CLAIRE COUTINHO MP

Like many of you, I had the pleasure of getting my first dose of the vaccine recently. I pay testament to all involved and am so grateful for the role they've played in getting us on the path to normal life.

Now that we can get out and about, I've been checking in on our local businesses like the Kindred Bakery in Whyteleafe and three of our fantastic local pubs - the Botley Hill Farmhouse in Warlingham, the Bell in Outwood, and the Station Pub in Nutfield. The food was, as always, delicious, and it was wonderful to hear that residents have been flocking back to support them.

I also called in on Deano Cline and Sara Jones at the Whyteleafe Hub. Set up in the back of Whyteleafe Tavern, the volunteers at the hub deliver food parcels to over 40 families from supplies donated locally. They now want to transform one of the pub's halls into a community space for social events and volunteer groups, so I was delighted to connect them to Your Fund Surrey - a £100 million for local community projects just like this one - and I'm really looking forward to seeing what they'll do next.

It was terrific to finally visit East Surrey's new Youth Hub recently too, which has a moving presence in Caterham, Oxted and Redhill, and I was delighted to be joined by the Minister for Employment, Mims Davies MP, as well as several local leaders. We had the chance to speak to Tanya and Grace, who shared their experiences of being two of the first people to use the Youth Hub. Best of luck to them both - I can't wait to hear about their progress in the coming weeks.

After visiting the Youth Hub, I also had the pleasure of meeting David Fletcher, who worked closely with Tandridge Council to set up the Workary in Caterham, which is a shared workspace located in the same building. The initiative was originally set up by David in Wimbledon but he's now working with a number of local councils to set up more sites across the country. I particularly enjoyed my tour of their podcast studio, run by one of the regulars at the Workary. It's a really impressive set-up and I can't wait to record a podcast there soon.

I also caught up with the Chief Executive of Gatwick Airport, Stewart Wingate, recently. One of the issues raised was making green list travel easier and we also talked about the importance of getting international agreement on travel arrangements. I asked them to consider including the RH6 7 and RH6 8 postcodes in Horley in their Local Commuter Scheme, which provides access for two free visits per day to the South Terminal drop off zone, and this is something they have agreed to consider. I also raised concerns with the council about access for cyclists to the airport and I'm pleased to say consultations and workshops are currently taking place and I expect to hear more from them soon.

Another focus of mine this month has been HGVs in Smallfield, Burstow, Outwood and Horne. I recently met with the Roads Minister, Baroness Charlotte Vere, to discuss the local concerns and proposals I put to the Department for Transport following the public meeting I held in January. And I am so delighted to share that, after my question to the Prime Minister on the topic at PMQs, the Government will be formally reviewing the role of the Traffic Commissioner – which was one of our key asks. I am also pleased to share that the Government will be bringing forward legislation this year to give local authorities enforcement powers against moving traffic offences. Crucially, the Minister agreed this will include HGVs using the wrong roads and ignoring 'unsuitable for HGV' signs.

And after much banging on doors over recent months, I am also so pleased to share that resurfacing works have now been completed on Massetts Road. I want to pay tribute to Matt Furniss, Cabinet Member for Highways at Surrey County Council, for agreeing to make this work a priority, and to all the Horley Town Councillors for their efforts.

Finally, it's been a long time coming but I know how much we are all looking forward to 19 July - I do hope you're all able to spend some time this summer catching up with much-loved family and friends.

JUNE MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

ADVICE FOR RESIDENTS WITH SEPTIC TANKS AND SMALL SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANTS

Many of the properties in Outwood are not connected to mains sewers and their sewage will go into one of the following: a septic tank; a small sewage treatment plant; a cesspool or a non-standard system such as a reed bed. As an operator of one of these systems you must not cause pollution.

If the liquid effluent is being discharged into the ground you can use a septic tank or a small sewerage treatment plant. However, if the discharge is going into surface water such as a river or stream, you must have a small sewerage treatment plant installed.

The Environment Agency has some guidance summarized below

Maintenance

You must have your septic tank or treatment plant emptied once a year.

You must check the area where you release sewage once a month for signs of pollution (please bear in mind that this site might not be on your own property).

Check for polution

If you release sewerage into the ground, check for sewerage smells and signs that your sewerage isn't draining properly (eg pools of water in the area where you release sewerage).

If you release sewerage into the water, check for sewerage smells, overflowing sludge or a white scum or foam on the water around the area where you release sewerage.

Record keeping

You must keep records of work done to empty, maintain or repair your tank.
You must keep records of any accidents, problems and complaints.




