Rector's Ramblings

I was talking with my son Christopher the other day, wondering about what I could write in this month's Rector's Ramblings. "Write about your tomatoes," he said.

I rather neglected my vegetable plot over the last couple of years, but I've reinvigorated it this year. But because I've filled it with plants that I happened to find at the plant sales at St Mary the Virgin and St John the Baptist as well as accepting any plants that people happened to be giving away, I've ended up with 49 tomato plants – almost a commercial nursery garden!



But it's lovely having them and I have a real sense that they are good for my soul and, closely connected to that, my mental health. I go out each day and look at them; they need nurture, care, feeding and watering. I can understand why the term nursery is applied to garden centres – these plants are like babies needing my care and attention.

I have visited them twice so far while I write this letter. When I'm not sure about the next sentence or where the whole thing is going, I find visiting the tomatoes helps. Not because I'm thinking about what I'm writing when I visit them, but because I'm not thinking about it! Being with the plants absorbs all my attention – no attention is left to be thinking, or for that matter worrying, about anything else. It's a bit like rebooting the computer. If my computer is playing up, I've learnt that the first thing to do is to switch it off, leave it for a few seconds then start it again. It solves a lot of issues. And going out to tend my tomatoes is a kind of spiritual reboot. I come back in and write a bit more.

It's also something I do each morning, and when I say each morning, I mean it's how I start the day: to go out and spend that bit of time connecting with nature. And connecting with nature is about connecting to the rhythms of life, to the weather and the seasons, to the times of the day and to the earth itself, not just the earth of the ground but the Earth herself.

I think we each need to have the means in our lives whereby we regularly – daily – connect with nature. Connecting with nature is a way of connecting with ourselves because we are part of nature and connecting with nature also connects

us to God. I love the words of the Orthodox monk Father Zosima In Dostoyevsky's *The Brothers Karamazov*, urging all who listen to him to:

Love all God's creation, the whole of it and every grain of sand.

Love every leaf, every ray of God's light.

Love the animals, the plants, love everything.

If you love everything, you will perceive the divine mystery in things.

So you might like to ponder this question: Where are your tomato plants? You may well have some actual tomato plants, but when I ask you that question, I'm not necessarily thinking of actual tomato plants but something that fulfils a similar role in your life. It may be in your garden smelling the roses, or it may be in a more open space, in woods or by water, your allotment (like my son) or simply beside the pavement on the way to the shops. Wherever it is, let it be a place that enables you to switch off, to be in the moment with all your attention, not thinking or worrying – a spiritual reboot as I called it. And as you go on your way again, let it remind you how precious life is and that more often than not, the best things in life are free – like a lot of my tomato plants were!

We had invited the author Gill Thompson to speak to us at our June meeting. Always passionate about writing, Gill did a masters degree in creative writing when she was fifty, then took nine years to write her first book "The Oceans Between Us" which is a heart-rending account of a young child migrant to Australia whose mother back in England spends years trying to be reunited with him. The scandal of Australia's all white migrant scheme, coupled with the British government's complicity in dispatching children without the knowledge of their families, led to many tragic stories but Gill managed to personalise it with her vivid descriptions of the sense of loss – and abuse – suffered by her characters. Following on the heels of this successful book, Gill has continued to put children at the centre of her stories, all showing how war and conflict can impact in terrible ways on innocent victims. Her novels are intricately researched and Gill held us spellbound with her oral and visual presentation of the historical people and events which have inspired her stories. Many of our members bought copies of the novels and the conversations around the moral questions raised continued into the afternoon: a testimony to Gill's assertion that creativity has great power to encourage social awareness.

NATURE WATCH

I twas the day after I completed my last piece for this column in which I mentioned that I had not heard a cuckoo for the last three years. In fact the more I think back it could even be four or five years, because the last time was when working with the local National Trust volunteers, east of Bletchingley Lane over towards Lodge Farm. This time I was taking Tess for her daily walk along the bridleway that leads from the top of Hornecourt Hill to Tile Barn. Conditions were warm, sunny and still and half way along I stopped to listen to the silence, and then, as if on cue, I heard the nostalgic call of the cuckoo, just for about half minute and at a little distance but unmistakeable and in the same area that I'd heard the last one. That was also the first week of what has become, by the time of writing, four weeks of clear blue skies and almost non-stop sunshine accompanied by a cold northerly air flow, mostly northeasterlies, which although they've taken the edge off the temperatures the winds were often strong and gusty enough to slam doors and blow off leaves and twigs from trees. As we moved into the third week of June thunder storms were forecast but were mainly of short duration with barely enough rain to do more that top up the rain butts and did little to moisten the parched earth and some trees, which began to show signs of stress with limp leaves. By and large they will bounce back.

As we are all aware by now the combination of the drought last year and the early cold snaps last autumn have taken their toll on the plant kingdom and some of the effects can be seen in village gardens with many people reporting dead shrubs and trees. In our garden a cherry tree (*Prunus autumnalis*), which as usual had produced flowers during the mild periods from autumn through to early spring but the leaves did not appear and the tree looked dead. Then suddenly, in the second week of June, weeks later than normal, leaves started to show and yet another flush of flowers appeared. Meanwhile, a sapling elm tree I've mentioned before that stands in the hedge on the bend in Bellwether Lane and has reached almost fifteen metres, was, just like our cherry, very late producing leaves and a number of branches appear to have died off but I'm hoping it is not as a

result of Dutch Elm disease but dryness at the roots.

However, not all has been doom-and-gloom, rather the opposite. Despite the wind, the sunny warm conditions were ideal for garden and wild flowers; we all enjoyed a flaming June and I don't think I can ever remember such a fantastic show from the roses. The leak in the garden pond seems to have repaired itself - fingers crossed and water levels returned to normal. Within a day light brown coloured smooth newts (Lissotriton vulgaris) and common frogs appeared together with a wide range of insects skating over the water. Although I saw the odd darter dragon fly from late May, the scent of the water attracted both them and damsel flies that immediately joined up in pairs, laying eggs on floating weeds. Birds have been busy feeding and fledging their young and I had a couple of rare sightings, which included a pied wagtail at the top of Millers Lane and a yellow hammer visiting the feeder. Noticeably butterfly numbers are down.


