

CHURCH NEWS

Rector's Ramblings

I've recently returned from ten days away in Dorset. Our post-Easter break is usually in France but Covid restrictions meant that we were unable to go abroad so we rented a house in Swanage. I was chatting about my time away to Michael Harvey, who many of you will know, and he said he remembered Swanage for three things: the train, Corfe Castle and the sea – in that order. I said I remembered it for those three things as well, except in reverse order – the sea, Corfe Castle and the train! I loved the steam train puffing, chugging and whistling its way between Swanage and Corfe, a reminder of a bygone age.



I loved Corfe Castle, a ruin from a much older bygone age, but still an amazing feature in the landscape and so evocative of "knights of old" (and incidentally maybe also the inspiration for Enid Blyton's Kirrin Castle). But first on the list for me had to be the sea – the stunning views along the South-West Coast path, the beautiful blues and the sheltered bays and coves.

But what also struck me about the area was the number of churches dedicated to the saint whose name I share, Saint Nicholas. It dawned on me that you tend to find churches dedicated to St Nicholas by the sea because he is (among other things) the patron saint of sailors and fishermen. When those churches were built those who earnt their living by and on the sea knew, along with their families, that the sea was (and still is) often a dangerous place to be and having a saint who you feel is on your side and from whom you can request prayers was a benefit.

St Nicholas and seaside churches is an obvious connection but often the reason for a church's dedication is lost in the midst of time. The three churches of the benefice have popular dedications. St Mary the Virgin, Horne has by far the most common dedication for a church and St Bartholomew, Burstow's dedication, though less common for more recent churches, was a popular one in the medieval times from which the church dates. Although St John the Baptist, Outwood is by far the youngest of the three churches I haven't able to find out why he was chosen for Outwood, though it is probably again simply because it is a popular dedication.

However, talking of St John the Baptist, the Christian Church celebrates his birth this month, on 24th June and at Outwood we celebrate it on the nearest Sunday to his birth – this year it's Sunday 27th June.

CHURCH NEWS

You are very welcome to come along and you may already be planning to, but it may be that church going is not your thing. However, one of the special things about the online services we created because of lockdown has been that many people who didn't usually go to church have told me that they have been 'going to church' more than they ever have done because online worship is so much more accessible for them. (You can find all the online services here: www.windmillchurches.co.uk)

Another special thing about lockdown is that we have kept all three churches open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. I feel this is very important as although church services are very much a part of my life, I also love sitting alone in an empty church. I love the silence and the stillness and when out on one of my walks, whether recent ones in Dorset or past ones on the South Downs, I never pass a church without trying the door and hopefully going inside. It always disappointments me to find a locked one.

At one of the churches I stopped at recently I found cards on the pews which said this:

Whether you have come to a Sunday service, a wedding or a funeral, for some quiet personal reflection, or just to take a look – then whoever you are, and whatever you believe in, you are welcome. If you are here for a service and you don't know what to do, please don't worry – no one will mind. We do hope, however, that you will share with us a sense that this is a special place.

I like those words, especially the bit about whoever you are and whatever you believe in. They sound all embracing and all welcoming. And that is how I like to think of God.

So if you are passing one of the churches of the benefice feel free to try the door. They are always open, you are always welcome and they are special places. But remember as well, that wherever you are: where you are, God is.



SUMMER COURSE IN MOSAIC-MAKING

22nd June - 27th July LLOYD HALL 7.00 - 9.30pm

Jane Hughes, mosaic maker, is pleased to offer a short course in mosaic-making suitable for complete beginners, as well as those with a little experience.

The course will be 6 weeks long in total, but the first 2 weeks can be viewed as a taster session where you will complete either an 8 inch x 8 inch square or heart shape which may be used as a trivet, or hung on a wall as a decorative piece. If you enjoy this, and would like to work on something more adventurous, or you need more time to complete your work, you can continue for another 4 weeks, and Jane will help you to put your new skills into practice as your confidence grows.

Throughout the course you will learn:

- the basics of project planning and design
- how to prepare substrates
- cutting techniques
- correct use of adhesives
- how to work safely
- how to grout
- how to display your finished piece

In the event that you do not manage to complete your project in the 6 weeks, Jane will provide grout, and extra materials will be available to purchase at minimal cost.

If there is enough interest, there may be the option of continuing the course in September.

Mosaic- making is a little bit addictive!

Costs: Week 1 and 2 (Tuesdays 22nd and 29th June) £50 to include all materials and instruction

Costs: Week 3-6 (Tuesdays 6th, 13th, 20th and 27th July)

£100 to include mosaic materials and instruction (but not substrate) * See notes below

*Note on substrates. If you would like to complete a piece of your own choosing, it will be necessary to provide your own substrate (base). For example, you may wish to cover a vase or shallow bowl, or the base of a wooden tray. You would have to provide this, and Jane would need to check its suitability. Jane has a selection of substrates for you to purchase, or can direct you to specialist shops.

NATURE WATCH

Topsy turvey - is a phrase that perfectly describes the weather so far this year with continuous periods of rain, weeks of dry, sunny, windy and cold conditions with records regularly being broken, all of which is clear evidence that weather patterns are changing. The month of April was a case in point with lower than average rainfall resulting in it being the sunniest on record, the lowest minimum temperature since 1922, overnight temperatures hovered around freezing point and were 3°C lower than the long term average, and the outcome was that April was also the frostiest on record. As we moved into May these conditions persisted due to a static high pressure zone giving us northerly winds from the arctic. The wind was what I call irritating - the sort that slams doors shut leaving you locked out on the wrong side, or flower pots and anything else that was not screwed down being blown around the garden. These changes in the weather pattern, or should that more correctly be climate, have already started to show with reports of frost damage to vines and fruit trees likely to result in big reductions in crops. The cold conditions have slowed the development of many other food, garden and wild plants. A phenomenon I've noted this year has been the amount of chickweed in the garden. Chickweed (Stellaria media), which is a groundcover weed and has always been a regular but this year it has appeared in plague proportions with carpets of it growing through established perennials all round the garden. It is as though the wind picked up a ton of seed and scattered it around. However, it is not just me because similar reports have come in from around the village and maybe it is linked to the cooler conditions in the spring which suit this plant.

At the beginning of May I heard from Tony Cooper that his new neighbour Joanna Barnet had seen what she thought was a goshawk in her garden. When I contacted her Jo told me that she had taken some photographs through the window and kindly sent me copies plus one of a group of young slow worms - more on them later. The photos were unfortunately a little blurry but it seemed clear that the bird was more likely a female sparrow-hawk, which from the number of sightings do seem to have increased locally over the last couple of years.

Some years I don't see one and in others many. So it has been this year with slow worms. Already I've seen four and one of them just appeared slithering across the driveway instead showing up, as they usually do, when clearing leaves or turning the compost. The slow worm (*Anguis fragilis*) is neither a worm nor a snake but a legless, tunnelling, lizard. Adults are around 45-50cms in length and a brown/silver grey in colour but during the first two years they are amber/gold on



the back and black on the belly as can be seen in Jo Barnet's photograph. They have a lifespan of up to 30 years in the wild but up to fifty years in captivity; they hibernate between October and March. They are carnivorous feeding on slugs, snails, spiders and other insects. They mate in April/May and the eggs hatch inside the female within a protective membrane where they feed on the residual yolk until they are born in late August/September. Characteristics include the ability to swim and unlike snakes they shed their skin in patches and have eyelids.

A Public Meeting is taking place online on Tuesday 15th June at 7.30pm


The committee is keen to have extensive participation from villagers as it is your opportunity to hear about the results of the feasibility study, ask questions and provide feedback.

Outlying buildings not included in the zones may be eligible for alternative schemes.


