Rector's Ramblings

The month of June begins with the celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and a number of events are taking place in both Outwood and Smallfield. In church we are marking the occasion with an outside joint benefice service at St Mary's Horne on Sunday 5th June at 10am.

The Queen's accession to the throne happened on 6th February 1952, the day her father died. Her coronation took place the following year on 2nd June 1953 and was the most watched event in the history of television at the time. Over 20 million people watched it.



Despite the fact that more television sets were bought in the UK in the two months before the Coronation than in any two months since then there were only about 2 and a half million television sets for all those people to look at. Crowding into homes in the street that had a 14-inch black and white television was part of the sense of occasion of the day.

The Archbishop of Canterbury at the time, Geoffrey Fisher, considered television to be an extravagance and a supreme time-waster and had been firmly opposed to the coronation being televised. So was the Prime Minister of the time, Winston Churchill. Television, especially live television, was felt to be an unseemly intrusion into a sacred service and into the heart of majesty. And there was also a very real fear that things could go embarrassingly wrong before the gaze of the live camera and the curious eyes of the world. Apparently, the Archbishop was also worried that his bald head would shine too much under the camera lights! Churchill's Cabinet decided only to show the Queen leaving Westminster Abbey but there was a public outcry at this. In the end the Queen had the final say and all of the ceremony was shown live on television.

Or rather nearly all. The most important part, the central part, wasn't. The Anointing was considered too sacred to be televised and also, in a sense, too intimate. The Anointing is based on a biblical ceremony. Zadok the Priest anointed King Solomon and all kings and queens of England and of the United Kingdom have been anointed at their coronations. The anointing prayer used by the archbishop in 1953 was used by archbishop Dunstan at the anointing of the first ever King of All England, King Edgar in 973.

As Handel's anthem Zadok the Priest was sung, the Queen's velvet robe was removed, along with her diamond diadem and coronation necklace, leaving her in a simple white dress, a sign of her humility before God, the Lord of Lords and King of Kings. A canopy was held over the Queen, shielding her from the eyes of those present within Westminster Abbey as the Archbishop prayed for God's blessing upon her. He then took up the oil on his fingers and turned to go under the canopy. No one saw what happened next, but his voice could be heard as he anointed the new Queen on her hands, breast and head. Elizabeth's anointing was a recognition of her need for God's help to fulfil her vocation, her calling, a vocation of love and service to God and her people. She has done that admirably and is an example to us all.

We are not kings or queens, we were not anointed at a coronation, but we are all called, we all have a vocation of love and service to others. We are called to reflect the image of God in our lives through the way we care for others and serve our community in whatever way we can. In her Christmas message last December, the Queen said this:

February, just six weeks from now, will see the start of my Platinum Jubilee year, which I hope will be an opportunity for people everywhere to enjoy a sense of togetherness; a chance to give thanks for the enormous changes of the last seventy years – social, scientific and cultural – and also to look ahead with confidence.

Togetherness is such an important concept. As John Donne famously said: *no man is an island*. We are all connected to one another and need one another – we are all neighbours, whether we live in the same village or the same world. John Donne wrote his words in the 17th century but writing in the 20th century, Sydney Carter echoes their meaning in his words:

When I needed a neighbour were you there, were you there? When I needed a neighbour were you there? And the creed and the colour and the name won't matter, were you there?

NATURE WATCH

ur warm, early spring continued on through April into May with a continuing parade of colour and life awakening in the natural world. A fresh start, a new beginning with bright colours, a symphony of bird song and every shade of green the eye could wish for.

Despite the dry weather, which had been the main feature since early March, plants responded with a huge burst of growth and the continuing early appearance of spring flowers. From the beginning of May cow parsley was lining tracks and pathways with their metre and a half, hollow, furrowed stems topped with white flower heads - compound umbels comprising a myriad of small stems each in turn carrying up to sixteen, minute, five petalled blooms. The flowers are inclined to make the plants top heavy so with the gusty winds, which have been another feature of our weather this spring, they've flopped across footpaths greatly reducing the width and after a shower of rain giving passers-by a soaking. Cow parsley (*Anthrisus sylvestris*) is a biennial or short-lived perennial in

the same family as fennel and ground elder. It has a huge number of local and dialect names and many of them give a clue to its poisonous nature. Known as Scabby hands in Yorkshire due to phytochemicals, which cause blistering of the skin, and Devils Parsley in Surrey, due to toxins in the leaves and stems, which, if swallowed, cause respiratory collapse and even death. Yet another poisonous plant is Dog's Mercury (Mercurialis perennis) a member of the spurge family, which is often overlooked, as it is a low growing, woodland plant and although it is unshowy, it often forms in great drifts. The plant is dioecious, in that male and female plants are separate entities and need to be near each other to multiply. Other plants to have flowered early and stand out in shady conditions are pale pink Herb Robert and red campion, both flowers having five petals. Two trees have put on a real show this year. Firstly, the not to be missed horse chestnuts with their large, candle shaped flowers in red and white looking so much like decorated Christmas trees and secondly the hawthorns, mostly with white flowers but some in shades of red.

Last month I mentioned a robin's nest in the garage and that the chicks were close to fledging. They did but nature took its course and from the evidence of the scattering of small feathers below the nest it looks as though one was taken. We've spotted some young robins around the feeders, so it looks as though some of them survived. I also saw a pied wagtail – the first this year. Yet another update is that Tony Cooper looked again at the large dead crow he had found in his garden and on closer inspection spotted a wound in the chest, which he believed was made by an airgun pellet. Other reports have included one from Gerald Sharpe who heard a cuckoo in the first week of May. I have to admit I haven't heard one for a couple of years. One also from Tony Hall who reported spotting the white squirrel in his garden, which was seen so frequently in the Wasp Green Lane area last autumn.

By the second week of May weather started to change as the jet stream shifted position, temperatures started to rise bringing thunder storms and some periods of long-awaited rain. Interestingly the level of the Bough Beech reservoir was higher than at the same time in 2020.
