#### **CHURCH NEWS**

#### **Rector's Ramblings**

Last month in my Rector's Ramblings I looked *forward* to the coronation, reflecting on the designs for the Coronation invitations and the official emblem of the Coronation. This month I cannot help but look back on what for me, and I think for many of you, was a very special weekend.

There are two lasting images that I have been left with, both from the coronation service itself. The first is from the first words spoken in the service, not by the Archbishop, the King or another dignitary but by a young chorister, Samuel Strachan. He greeted the King with these words:



Your Majesty, as children of the Kingdom of God we welcome you in the name of the King of Kings,

to which the king replied:

In his name and after his example I come not to be served but to serve.

The King of Kings is a title given to Jesus in the Bible. But time and time again in the Gospels we see and hear that Jesus is not a king who lords it over his subjects but serves them, the prime example of this being when he washes his disciples' feet on that first Maundy Thursday. Jesus is *the* Servant King and Charles, following that example, intends to be a servant king.

I was talking about this in an assembly I did at Burstow School following the coronation. I had a picture on the screen of Samuel and King Charles with the words they had spoken written on them. I told them that the theme running through the coronation was one of service and that's why it had begun with those words. At this point a Reception pupil put her hand up and asked me what the word 'service' meant. I had in fact anticipated that question and my next picture had the words *Service is Kindness*. She knew what kindness meant.

The other image that stayed with me from the coronation was of King Charles being disrobed by the attending bishops, leaving him standing there, not in his royal regalia, but in a simple white undershirt and black trousers. The disrobing came just before the most sacred part of the coronation service, the anointing, and it symbolises that before God we are all equal. At that point, King Charles looked so vulnerable, so ordinary and somehow so dependent on the people helping him. He was *being served* rather than *serving* and that moment, when the servant king is being served, reminded me of the words of the hymn, 'Brother Sister let me serve you':

Brother, sister, let me serve you; let me be as Christ to you; pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant too.

These two images together powerfully expressed the other theme that ran through the service, that of the connection between the past and the future. The words of the service were rooted in centuries of tradition, some going back to biblical times and the anointing of kings in the Old Testament. The King himself, in a way, represents the past, especially to young people, simply by being part of his generation rather than theirs. This was illustrated not long after King Charles became king when he was on a walkabout in East London and passed a group of primary school children. A pupil called out "How old are you, King Charles?" to which the King, chuckling, replied "You can have a guess," to which another child shouted out "96" causing King Charles to chuckle even more. Interested by this observation I had started my assembly with a picture of King Charles and asking the children how old they thought he was. A lot of hands went up and the first pupil I asked said 96!

If the King and the words of the service represented the past, having a young chorister (and the pupils accurately guessed his age at 14) greet the King represented the future, a point specifically made in the commentary on the coronation service on the royal family's official website (Royal.uk): "the inclusion of a young person symbolises looking towards the future". Young and old can learn from each other. In many ways in our technological age, instead of the older generation passing on the skills of their trade to the younger generation, the reverse takes place. It is the younger generation who help the older generation – the pupils of Burstow School are able to help their grandparents work their computers and phones. But I ended my assembly with the words "The knowledge of youth becomes the wisdom of age" and the message that though they, the young people can now teach their elders they also can learn from them too – and not to forget that!

The importance of serving others and allowing them to serve us, young and old together, is my lasting memory of the coronation and I close my look back at the coronation with the words from the Archbishop of Canterbury's opening prayer:

Let us dedicate ourselves alike, in body, mind, and spirit, to a renewed faith, a joyful hope, and a commitment to serve one another in love.

# THE MINSPIRING WOMEN

#### **MAY 2023**

We began our May meeting by welcoming four new members, as well as remembering our oldest member, Jean Bristow, who recently died at the age of 99.

We are all now spending longer out of doors, enjoying the developing colours of spring. Our visiting speaker this month was Paul Patton, a member of the Countryside Restoration Trust, who inspired us all to take up gardening habits to encourage more wildlife into our gardens. At a time when many small mammals in the countryside are under threat, we should all adapt our practices so that we can help to create an environment which allows the natural world to flourish. Using a series of slides, he explained the science behind creating a nourishing food base within our soil. Paul also offered much practical advice for gardens of all sizes: create "no dig" beds using leaf mould and wood chips; make or buy a wormery and an insect house; choose a wide range of plants including wild flowers. His final message was a welcome one: don't be too tidy – leave a natural habitat for the local wildlife to enjoy!



Our members take turns to provide tea and cake for the monthly meetings. This month our welcoming group of Pat, Pauline and Anne modelled the new personalised aprons we have bought. The purple colour chosen reflects the traditional colour of the suffragette banners!

#### **NATURE WATCH**

By mid-May the incessant rain of the previous eight weeks gradually eased and temperatures rose only slightly. Gradually the sun put in more regular appearances but the northerly winds, often quite strong, kept temperatures considerably down on the long-term average and the net result was that the plant growth was slowed. However, the range of shades of green of the newly emerging leaves have been beautiful but so short lived. It reminds me of my late, old friend Andy Tait who, on a visit to UK to see his wider family, had arranged to come over for lunch but he was more than an hour late. In explanation he said that as it was springtime he decided to drive through the back lanes from Hampshire and was so entranced by the huge range of leaf colours and tones he just lost his way and track of time – living in Western Australia he was more used to the dull grey/greens of eucalyptus.

One high spot this spring has been the unusually profuse flowering of trees, shrubs and wild flowers. My feeling is that this is the natural response of plants that have experienced stress as they did with the prolonged hot weather and drought of last summer coupled with the low temperatures of early winter. The white flowers of the early flowering blackthorn turned the hedges into a blaze of light and were promptly followed by the white mayflowers of hawthorns, often with a blush pink.

A flower that has appeared in abundance this year is cuckoo pint aka lords and ladies (*Arum maculatum*), which is native across Europe and Turkey, is a shade loving plant that can be found along stream and woodland edges. The flowers appear in April and May and comprise a 25cms light green hood or spathe and a stalk or spadix, the shape of which gives rise to the unusual name, which has its root in the old word pintle meaning penis dating back to the early 16th century. Other local names also reflect this link such as jack-in-the pulpit; pokers in Wiltshire; priests pintle in Derby and Durham and dog's dibble or bobbins in Devon. Female flowers are found at the base with male flowers above and the faecal odour attracts owl midges, responsible for cross pollination with other flowers. The spadix is mainly purple but occasionally yellow and bears red berries which are eaten by birds but are toxic to most mammals.



Talking of cuckoo pint leads on to a report from Ann Hooper Smith who spotted a cuckoo, two days running in early May in trees on Outwood Common. The bird was making a gurgling, chuckling sound, which identified it as female because it is the male that calls cuckoo. The earliest this year was on 22<sup>nd</sup> April from the village of Small Dole in Sussex where my brother lives – I haven't heard one this year or for the last three. A call from Andy Wright in mid-May gave news of a nightingale that had settled in the shrubby, wooded area of his grounds and was singing regularly, sometimes during the afternoon. So, I took up his invitation to visit and waited patiently but without luck, however it is so good to know they are still visiting the village. Another report, also in mid-May, came from Jane and Ralph at Brightleigh with news of a single swift flying around their pond – perhaps the one we saw last week when Yvonne also spotted a group of four swallows. Let us hope there are more to come.


