Rector's Ramblings

March this year sees the beginning of Lent – 6^{th} March is Ash Wednesday. Lent is a particular time in the year for creating in our daily lives a space for quiet and prayer, reflection and renewal. The 40 days of Lent remind us of Jesus's 40 days in the wilderness and they also remind me of my 40 days in the Sinai desert when I was on sabbatical back in 2014.

When I was planning my sabbatical I first thought of walking from the place of my birth, Stonesfield in Oxfordshire, to Santiago de Compostela in North-West Spain.



In the end I decided to go into the desert instead and I know that was the right decision back then. But I think I would one day like to make my walk.

I don't know if you've heard of Santiago de Compostela, but it has been a place of pilgrimage for over a thousand years and people have walked there from all over Europe, finishing at the cathedral and the shrine of St James.

I've always felt an affinity with St James; after all I am named after him. My second name is James, after St James's Church, Stonesfield where my Dad was the rector. From my childhood I've always remembered a banner of St James hanging in the church, depicting him standing on the top of a mountain, a staff in one hand and a scallop shell in the other. I was pleased to see that it still hangs in the church when I returned for a visit last year as part of my 60th birthday celebrations and looking just now at the picture I took of it then I see the staff is just like the one I took into the Sinai desert with me. It will obviously have to accompany me if I do do the walk to Compostela!

The scallop has long been a symbol of the Camino de Santiago, or the Way of St James, as the pilgrimage is called in English. The lines of the shell, starting spread out at the edge and converging at the base of the shell symbolize the different starting points of the pilgrims and their one finishing point. Though there are traditional routes and different starting points ultimately it is said of the Camino that it begins from the front door of your house.

I'd like you to step out with me on the Camino this Lent – but you won't need your walking boots! This year in the Lent Course running in the benefice we will be watching The Way, a film about one man's journey on the Camino, the group of people he meets and the way he is changed by his experience and reflecting on our own journey through life.

As one review put it: The Way is a powerful and inspirational story about family, friends, and the challenges we face while navigating this ever changing and complicated world. As the group make their way across the mountains, defences break down as each of the group comes to realize that life is not so much about changing the things you don't like about yourself. Sometimes it's more about accepting who you really are, and then moving on, content with that knowledge.

If you would like to attend the Lent Course the details of the dates and times follow this letter. And even if you don't attend, you can still try and make a bit of space for yourself in another way during Lent and maybe reflect on the words you've just read: *life is not so much about changing the things you don't like about yourself. Sometimes it's more about accepting who you really are, and then moving on, content with that knowledge.*

10am on Tuesdays, 10am on Wednesdays, 8pm on Wednesdays.



BURIAL GROUND AT ST. JOHNS' CHURCH

No doubt you will have seen over the last few months a planning site notice in place along Brickfield Road, adjacent to the church. After the lapse of over 4 years the PCC is pleased to report that planning consent has been granted for the change of use of land to burial ground.

The need for more burial space has become urgent as the present graveyard, after 150 years, has become full. National Trust as estate owner of Outwood Common, to include land behind and along side the church has agreed, subject to governance and working within the framework of the Charities Act to transfer the land to the Church. As National Trust land is inalienable,following planning consent Tandridge will put in place procedures to compulsory acquire the land and thereafter to transfer the land to the church (with the consent of DEFRA to release the land as commonland).

To reach this stage many hurdles have had to be crossed. When Outwood Common was gifted to National Trust the area was designated ancient woodland and it has taken a long time to get the land removed from the ancient woodland inventory. The local authority required tree reports, ecology reports, biodiversity reports, heritage statements, monument report, planning statements and so on.

The Parish Council fully supports the application. Undertakings and indemnities have been given to Tandridge with regard to its costs (£1,000.00) and an agreed level of compensation to be paid to National Trust under the Charities Act,(£3000.00) for transferring the land under the CPO. Doubtless there will be further legal costs to be incurred in the future, to be bourn by the PCC eg. National Trust, DEFRA and Southwark Diocese for transfer of land under the New Parishes Measure Act 1943.

You may have seen that the National Trust volunteers have been very active in clearing the site of scrub, with the consent of the area ranger, Eleanor Yoxhall. A very detailed tree report has been prepared by Paul Collis and those trees to be retained, oak, ash and some yew have been tagged. Our Councillor, Kevin Bourne has also been extremely helpful in smoothing out the wrinkles with the planning department at Tandridge (the 7th Case officer has just left, which gives some idea of the reason for the length of time all this has taken). The architects, Thomas Ford and Partners, who have been instrumental in dealing with the recladding of the exterior of the church, have greatly assisted in sorting out a myriad of technical problems.

Outwoodians, it will probably be some time before the burial ground is fit for purpose, with hedges planted, paths laid, seating area finalised but thought all should know what is being done to enlarge the burial ground.

The stonework repairs are complete and we will be arranging plenty of opportunities for you to come and appreciate your local heritage.

The Heritage Lottery Funded works include a new path to the porch and the installation of kitchen cabinets. Not forgetting of course all the equipment for the history & memorabilia exhibitions.

NATURE WATCH

s January came to a close and we moved into February the weather changed from being cold, frosty and dry to wet and windy courtesy of storm Erik, evidently named by the Irish met office. However, despite complaints about the earlier cold temperatures, conditions were generally mild and towards mid month crocuses and varieties of early daffodils were breaking into bloom. A high pressure zone over Europe brought us warm southerly winds and many days of wall to wall sunshine, including Valentine's Day when the mercury topped 13°C. The forecast for the later part of the month indicated more fine weather and the likelihood that February would turn out to be the warmest on record. Plants were responding with buds showing early and the ochre yellow catkins were dripping from the hazels along woodland edges.

Yet another welcome sight at this time were the bright yellow flowers of Witch Hazel or Chinese hazel (*Hamamelis mollis*), that are sweetly scented and have ragged spidery petals that emerge from a deep reddish purple base. The name witch and the older spelling wych does not refer to witches and magicians but is believed to come from the Old English word "wice" meaning pliant or bendable; the same word can be found in another tree, the wych elm (*Ulmus glabra*). The word "mollis" relates to the soft, felt-like leaves which turn beautiful shades of yellow touched with



orange during the autumn. The witch hazel or Chinese hazel was discovered in China in 1872 and seeds were sent back to England where they were germinated. Strangely this new introduction was ignored for over twenty years until the sole surviving tree was spotted and recognised by the then curator of the Royal Horticultural Society. There are a number of species of witch hazel some with yellow flowers and some with orange or red, which also show variable autumn leaf colours. Witch hazel has long a long history of use in folk medicine due to the fact that they contain high levels of tannins and anti inflammatories and has been used to treat variety of skin conditions such as bruises, insect bites, itchy skin, haemorrhoids and eye inflammation.

The RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch celebrated its 40th anniversary when this year's survey took place on 26 -28 January. The results from the 2018 survey showed a mixture of ups and downs. Blackbirds were down by 18%, robins by 12% and wrens by 11%. On the increase were long tailed tits which were up by 16%, coal tits by 15%, goldfinch by 11%, and the greenfinch and blue tits by 5%. The percentage of gardens in which some of our more popular birds were recorded remained quite high with blackbirds seen in 88% of gardens, robins in 83%, blue tits in 78% and woodpigeon in 77%. However, despite the encouraging rises, recorded bird numbers had dropped by 60% since the start of the survey in 1979.

Paul Pitts reported Canada geese grazing on nearby fields which are almost certainly amongst those that regularly fly back to their night time roosts from that direction, normally I hear their honking calls before seeing them usually in small skeins. Paul also mentioned that swans were back on the Marl pond, which was confirmed by Robin Tanner who as water bailiff said that the pond also has a regular in the form of Donald the Muscovy duck. Donald has evidently become so used to being fed with bread that at feeding time it will flap up to Robin almost taking the bread out of his hand

FEBRUARY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

County Councillor Thorn: Limited funding is being pooled across the county to pay for larger highways projects including flood mitigation.

District Councillors Bourne and Fitzgerald: Enforcement officers have visited Etheringtons. Planning permission has been granted for the burial ground.

National Trust: January's Wassail event was successful.

Planning: Current planning applications were discussed. 2019/138 concerns about unsustainable development. 2019/205 no objections.

MUGA and Wells field: Minor issues identified at a recent inspection will be dealt with by local volunteers. A recent cricket tournament raised funds for the MUGA.

Annual Village Meeting: 1st April Lloyd Hall will be preceded by a talk on wellbeing prescriptions.

Highways: There has been a recent spate of bottle throwing from cars on Dayseys Hill. Heavy rain has resulted in a lot of surface water on the roads. Outwood Lane is a particular problem. Parish Council will liaise with Surrey CC.

Lloyd Hall: The parking project has an estimated cost of £13-14,000. The Lloyd Hall and Parish Council have agreed to work together to seek funding.

Aviation and transport: Ian Frow went to Gatwick Airspace Change Meeting about Route 4. As a result of the judicial review a three-year checking and implementation period is underway but, in the mean-time aircraft will continue to use Route 4.

Community Matters: We will be holding a litter picking session in the village on Saturday 6th April 10am meet in the Castle Car Park. Please let the Parish Clerk know if you can join us. The lease for the Castle is up for sale. The Parish Council will look into applying for a grant to fund some community fitness equipment for the village.

Next meeting: Tuesday 12th March 2019 8pm Church Room.

Appeal for carpentry materials and project ideas for community reparation project in Outwood

A project has recently been set up by Surrey Family Services (SFS) in Outwood running a carpentry workshop for vulnerable young people and young people on a court order. Small groups meet at Hookhouse Farm, where the Wells family have kindly let us use one of their barns for the work. It is a six week programme enabling them to learn new skills, providing work experience and the facility to complete their community reparation order. The young people are referred to SFS through a number of agencies including CAMHS (child and adolescent mental health services) and the courts. They work on bespoke community-based projects under supervision.

Recent ones include building three disabled ramps for the church and church rooms.

Where possible we recycle materials and Outwood Cricket Club donated their old sightscreen last summer which has been used to build the disabled ramps and other items.

Funding for this programme is limited and does not cover costs of materials and fixings or any additional equipment we might need. We would be interested to hear if you have any wood, fixings or tools you would be willing to donate.

We would also welcome any carpentry-related community project ideas for the village that we could get involved with. We are unable to work off-site so construction can only take place at Hookhouse Farm, ready for delivery.

It seems like such a long time ago already, but I must mention the fabulous turn out for the Wassail in January. Thank you to everyone who came along and made it such a fabulous evening. Since the beginning of February, the Outwood Volunteers have been hard at work constructing tree guards and planting apple trees within a couple of orchards around the Harewoods Estate and Sandhills, to replace some of the trees that have been lost over the years.

Traditional orchards are really important habitats. But unfortunately orchards have declined in numbers around the UK by 63% since 1950. Mainly due to neglect, intensification of agriculture and from pressure from land development.
