

Rector's Ramblings

As you will know if you happened to read last month's Ramblings, I have recently been on retreat, something I always try and do just before the season of Lent begins.

On the Sunday I was there I walked across the fields from where I was staying to the local church in the Devon village of Doddiscombleigh, on the edge of Dartmoor. After the service and coffee at the back of the church, I wandered down to the village pub, misleadingly called The Nobody Inn as it actually was pretty full, for Sunday lunch. Unlike the time I wrote about last month, I



didn't write a poem in the pub (and I don't spend all my retreat time in pubs!) – poems either come or they don't. However, browsing through the parish magazine I'd picked up in the church, I came across an article entitled Sonder – a word I'd never heard of.

The author described how he'd recently lost a close relative and shortly after the death had gone for a walk with his family. He was struck how people cheerily greeted them not knowing what had happened, and illogical as it was, felt everyone should have known what they were going through. He then said how he was reminded of the word 'sonder' and quoted a definition:

'The realisation that each random passer-by is living a life as vivid and complex as your own—an epic story that continues invisibly around you like an anthill sprawling deep underground, with elaborate passageways to thousands of other lives that you'll never know existed, in which you might appear only once, as an extra sipping coffee in the background, as a blur of traffic passing on the highway, as a lighted window at dusk.' (Dictionary of Obscure Sorrows by John Koenig)

He went on to say this:

'The realisation I had on that walk, and the quote above, is a great reminder that we have no idea what is happening beneath the surface of a person, yet we can often so easily judge people without considering their story, circumstances and experiences. This reminder helped me shape my new year's resolution; to interact with every person I meet with love, kindness and respect as if they'd just lost a loved one."

And then he said this, and somehow this is the bit that spoke to me most of all: 'So I invite you to remember 'sonder' and treat everyone with love and respect; not as a reflection of their character *but of yours*.' [italics mine]

As I sat in The Nobody Inn with plenty of people in, I pondered those words, as I did for the rest of my retreat, and reflected on the times I fail to act like that. It also struck me that it was easier to be like that on retreat rather than in the hustle and bustle of my everyday life. Though a bit late for a new year resolution, I resolved to make it my Lenten resolution. I know I won't always live up to it – that's how it goes with Lenten resolutions – but I think it's important to keep trying. And when I say trying, I don't mean trying too hard, I think it's more about just relaxing, being present, practising love, kindness and respect and remembering what matters. It's simply about trying to live today well.

MOTHERING SUNDAY 19th March

During the 16th century, people in the UK used to return on the 4th Sunday in Lent for a service to their 'mother church' - the main church or cathedral of the area. This was either the church where you were baptised, or the local parish church or more often the nearest cathedral. Anyone who did this was c ommonly said to have gone "a-mothering", although whether this term preceded the observance of Mothering Sunday is unclear.

In later times, 'Mothering Sunday' became a day when domestic servants were given a day off to visit their mother church, usually with their own mothers and other family members. It was often the only time that whole families could gather together, since on other days they were prevented by conflicting working hours, and servants were not given free days on other occasions.

Children and young people who were given a day off on that date so they could visit their families would pick wild flowers along the way to place in the church or give to their mothers. Eventually, the religious tradition evolved into the Mothering Sunday secular tradition of giving gifts to mothers.

How does it feel to be 102 years old? The ladies at Outwood WI found out at their February meeting! And what a packed village hall it was! We had sent invitations out to other local WI groups and in the end we welcomed 34 visitors as well as a representative from the Surrey Federation. This meant that 76 voices raised the roof with "Happy birthday to us" while our president, Caroline, lit the candle on the celebration cake.

February's speaker was Peter Allen, who brought an entertaining slide show entitled "How Musicals Ruled the Stage".

Having worked in theatre all his life, Peter was able to take us on a journey through the history of musical theatre both on Broadway and in the West End of London.





We travelled from 1920s hits such as Showboat, through key productions which challenged the boundaries of musical theatre (such as West Side Story and Hair), then onto the show that broke all box office records: Phantom of the Opera. Some interesting conversations followed Peter's talk as members expressed their views on their own favourite shows

We have a full calendar of events to look forward to in 2023 and our monthly activity groups continue to grow. Another year older, perhaps, but going very strong!

NATURE WATCH

Sites including nest boxes, which ideally should be cleared of any material from last year. Squirrels have been increasingly active playing "chase me Charlie" in the tree tops, displaying their amazing agility. Leaf and flower buds were swelling day by day as in the garden with camellias and magnolias and even the fruit buds on an apricot were already showing dark pink in the third week of February - however they may need some protection if freezing weather is forecast. Out in the countryside the common gorse has been in bloom since the end of January with bushes on the common at the top end of Millers Lane and along Brickfields Road near Lamberts Place standing out like beacons. The sulphur yellow flowers, which have the scent of coconut, are edible and are used in salads. Gorse, which grows to two and a half metres, is a member of the legume family that includes peas and beans, have roots that fix nitrogen in the soil and their flowers provide an excellent source of pollen to bees and moths. So, spring is just around the corner. Its officially due to start on 20th March and as Christina Rossetti so beautifully put it in her poem Spring "There is no time like spring. When life's alive in everything."

Julie and Glenn Biddles reported a fascinating and rare experience they had on a visit to RSPB reserve at Pulborough Brooks in mid-February when, as they were watching from one of the hides, they spotted a large bird in a tree some way away – it was a white-tailed eagle and then, in the opposite direction a marsh harrier was having a fight, in flight, with a peregrine falcon. What happened next is best described in Julie's own words - "The peregrine had killed a lapwing and the harrier was trying to steal it. The peregrine saw it off and went back for the kill. The harrier came in and they had another tussle. Then the large bird from the tree flew in and started to eat the lapwing - both the harrier and peregrine flew off." At this point a second sea eagle arrived on the

scene and they took the lapwing carcass off to another location and Julie said "they looked stunning flying together." What a superb wildlife experience.

White tailed sea eagles (*Halliaeetus albicilla*) aka Erne, became extinct in the UK as a result of persecution around the end of the of the eighteenth century. The birds are the largest eagles in the UK and were once widely distributed across the UK down to the south coast and Cornwall. They have a wingspan of two and a half metres and they are predominantly brown with a paler head a neck with a white tail. In the 1970's a programme was set up to reintroduce birds to Scotland from Norway. This was a great success and achieved plenty of media coverage. Then in 2019 the Roy Dennis Foundation - Roy Dennis had been very involved in Scotland - and the Forestry Commission set up a programme to release sixty chicks from Scotland into the Isle of Wight over a period of five years. Once again reintroduction has proved successful and it was reported that a pair of birds had set up home in the Arun river valley, almost certainly the ones seen by Glenn and Iulie.

A couple early Outwood Show reminders:

The photographic competition categories this year will be 'Bugs and Butterflies, 'Summer time' and 'Gathering'. For children the topic is 'Playtime'.

Its time to start planting your giant Sunflower seeds for tallest sunflower competition.

To get you started if it's your first time you will need a sunny, sheltered spot and a good soil. Choose your variety carefully as some sunflowers will grow 50cm, while others grow over 3m.

Sow seeds in pots from April and plant out when all risk of frost has passed. Prepare the soil well and add plenty of organic matter to the planting hole.

Keep your sunflowers well-watered and feed weekly to encourage them to grow tall.

You may need to stake some of the taller varieties.



A PROPER CONTESTED ELECTION IS THE HEART OF DEMOCRACY

And that means candidates. A local council is responsible for the specific profile of a local community. This requires knowledge of and an empathy for the community which the more remote arms of local government cannot supply. Which is why, to be eligible to serve as a local councillor, you have to live and/or work in a 3-mile radius from the village centre.

Please think about it. The election will be formally called on 20th March and you then have until 4th April to find a proposer and seconder and fill in the application form

You then have another month to persuade people to vote for you before the election takes place on 4th May. There is no deposit to pay (or lose). All you need to commit is some of your time and a good deal of your heart.



You may have noticed a lot of potholes and also some flytipping in the area.

We would urge residents to report these issues to Surrey County Council on https://www.surreycc.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/roadworks-and-maintenance/report-a-highway-problem/road-or-cycle-lane-issues.

It's probably easier to go on the SCC website and follow through.




