OUTWOOD VILLAGE SIGN

Outwood Village sign did you know?

"Excuse me, is this Outwood? Where am I?" These questions were frequently posed to one of our lovely Outwood ladies in the early 1970s whilst she was walking on the common. Joan Wells. She decided to do something to rectify this lack of signage and if you think about it we still don't have any signs saying Welcome to Outwood!

She found some funds having asked a highly respected Outwood gentleman who lived at The Orchards a Mr Mallet who was chair of the Outwood Village Show Association. He agreed the costs could be covered by proceeds from the village show.

Joan started a design showing the windmill above the name and got permission from the National Trust to position it in an open light position not in front of trees which would obscure it.


She asked James Wells (not only a very busy farmer but also a blacksmith) to make it. James also crafted the iron brazier on the common which of course stands as Outwood Beacon for the Jubilee. Thank you James. This was made much later .

A 7 metre seasoned oak was found and it was cut to size and shape in the workshop of Mr John Sparks (Janet Rowlands father) and tractor and steam engines were used to hoist it into position with a lot of local manpower. The sign had to be high so that it can be seen in all directions and also to prevent vandalism. 1979 saw a dedication celebration on the Common .

So we will celebrate again our village sign in new glory as it is unveiled by Joan on Thursday June 2^{nd} thanks with the support of Outwood Parish Council.

Rector's Ramblings

In my letter last month I was talking about Easter, linking it to defibrillators, the breath of life and how the new life we celebrate at Easter is not just something we celebrate once a year but rather that every day should be a celebration of life as a gift from God.

Easter itself may seem a long time ago now, but in the church the Easter season lasts for fifty days, ending at the feast of Pentecost (what used to be called Whitsun). Easter was late this year which means that Pentecost falls on 5th June and we shall be celebrating it with a joint



outdoor service at 10am in Horne churchyard and using the occasion to also celebrate the Queen's Jubilee, giving thanks for her life of faith and service.

Easter being late means that the whole of the month of May this year is in the Easter season. But do you know why Easter was late? The date of Easter Day isn't a set date because the Early Church decided that Easter Day would be on the Sunday after the first full moon following 21st March (in other words the first full moon of spring). It's to do with the fact that Jesus' death and resurrection took place at the time of the Jewish Passover, which is held on the date of the first full moon of spring. This means that the earliest Easter can be is 22nd March and the latest it can be is 25th April. The full moon in March this year was 18th March, just before the beginning of spring so we needed to wait 29 days for the next full moon on April 16th. This being a Saturday meant Easter was the following day, 17th April.

All this meant that when I left Outwood Church following our special benefice Easter Eve evening service, during which in a dark church I lit the Easter Fire – a powerful symbol of the light of Christ bursting forth out of the darkness of Good Friday, I was greeted by the beautiful sight of the full moon rising behind the trees, pouring its light into the darkness outside.

The full moon this month will be on 16th May and this year it is combined with a lunar eclipse, when the shadow of the earth completely covers the moon, turning it red. It's an amazing thing to see but to view it we first need to have to have a clear sky and secondly an early start. You'll need to be up at about 4.30am to see it from here!

In ancient times solar and lunar eclipses tended to be seen as portents of doom and the Bible is no exception to that. The moon 'turning to blood' is a sign of the

turmoil at the end of the world. But a blood moon at a lunar eclipse is not that an uncommon event – it happens every couple of years or so and I'm not predicting the end of the world this month! Instead I would like to bring you back to where I began this letter – every new day being a gift from God – and leave you with a prayer from David Adam, former vicar of the island of Lindisfarne, or Holy Island, in Northumberland and whose prayers so often reflect the movement of the moon and the tides and the rhythm of life that living on an island creates. The prayer is called *New Day* and uses the image of the light of the sun, moon and stars as an image of the light of God to guide us each day:

This new day You give to me From Your great eternity This new day now enfold Me in Your loving hold

You are the star of the morn You are the day newly born You are the light of our night You are the Saviour by your might

God be in me this day
God ever with me stay
God be in the night
Keep us by thy light
God be in my heart
God abide, never depart.

NATURE WATCH

The Easter bank holiday weekend saw a continuation of the dry, warm weather conditions that prevailed over much of March and the early part of April, with a UK high of just over 23°C and locally the top mark was around 21°C. Unfortunately, the clear skies led to some low overnight temperatures giving one or two damaging frosts. Our wisteria was completely covered with more tasselled flower buds than ever before and all but one or two were desiccated and shattered on touching, and similarly the hydrangeas, many of which had the characteristic browning of the young leaf edges, looking as though someone had gone over them with a blow torch. The lesson in this case is don't cut off last year's dry flower heads until the risk of frost has passed - it will not stop all the frost damage but it will limit it enough for the dormant flower buds to recover. On the bright side, the warm temperatures encouraged plant life to start the springtime show. By Easter weekend carpets of bluebells had appeared in the woodlands - I've always felt that their colour is their very own, neither a blue nor a mauve but just bluebell. Oaks were breaking into leaf giving the trees a veil of lime yellow. Along woodland pathways, bridleways and hedgerows wild flowers were beginning to paint the landscape with their palette of fresh colours. First the whites including the pin cushion flowers of garlic mustard, deadnettle and the distinctive stars of greater stitchwort. Then the yellows of primroses and cowslips, and large splashes of dandelions well in advance of St George's Day on 23rd April - the traditional time for making dandelion wine. Then the blues represented by forget-me-nots and bluebells and then the most gorgeous delicate pale pink flowers of lady's smock. For hay fever suffers the bad news reappeared with the pollen produced by the flowers of willow and pine trees.

The warmer weather saw a huge surge in the numbers and species of insects, the appearance of which was perfectly timed for the hatching of the eggs of many birds. My first evidence of a nearby robin's nest was the very regular, distinctive call so close to the back door, followed by the sight of a pair adult robins flitting in and out of a gap at the top of the garage doors. It tuned out that they had built a nest on a ledge tucked in above the doors, which is now home to four chicks, until they fledge within a couple of weeks at the end of April after which they will then spend, usually about two weeks, with their parents before they become independent. These new robins will be an important addition to the population of this species, which still holds its sixth position on the results list of this year's Garden Birdwatch. Keeping the number one spot was the house sparrow, however it was noted that their numbers had declined drastically. At number two were the blue tits,



followed by starlings at number three and woodpigeons at four. A piece of good news was that the goldfinch had risen to number seven on the basis of continuing growth in their population, as for the woodpigeon, which was believed to be as a result of bird feeding.

Reports this month include one from Sylvia Maiklem who spotted a humming bird moth in early April and another from Tony Cooper who found a dead crow "as large as a chicken" - possibly due to poisoned prey. Mike F Johnson
