

Rector's Ramblings

I don't suppose you were lucky enough to receive a personal invitation to the Coronation, though it's not just "the great and the good" who have. Members of the public, over 1250 volunteers and young people, have received an invitation. But if you weren't one of them, you may have seen a picture of the invitation, and it's very beautiful.

It contains all sorts of heraldic images, including lions, unicorns and boars, all of them are surrounded by meadow flowers, such as lilies of the valley, cornflowers, wild strawberries, dog roses and bluebells.



There is wildlife too, including a bee, butterfly, ladybird, wren and robin nestled among the flowers. Talking about his design the artist said he wanted the invitation to reflect the King's "green credentials" and his passion for conservation and the environment, and as a particular symbol of this he placed an image of the Green Man, crowned in hawthorn blossoms, in a central position at the bottom of the invitation.

Though the Green Man image pre-dates Christianity (linked as it has been to the Greek and Roman god of wine and agriculture, Dionysus, also known as Bacchus), Green Man images began to appear in the illustrated Christian Celtic manuscripts of the 8th century, including the Book of Kells and the Lindisfarne Gospels. From the 11th and 12th centuries onwards, carvings of the Green Man appeared in churches and cathedrals across Europe, many in this country particularly in rural counties like Devon, Somerset, Oxfordshire and Norfolk. None in the three churches of the Windmill United Benefice though!

Celtic Christianity was deeply aware of the sacredness of creation – it too had "green credentials" and it was natural that it adopted the imagery of the Green Man and applied it to Christ. The intricate vines rather than hawthorn blossoms that often surround the Green Man clearly evoke the image of Christ as the true vine: *I am the true vine and my father is the gardener* (John 15:1)

In the Gospel of Easter Day when Mary meets the risen Christ we read that she *supposes him to be the gardener* (John 20:15). This mistaken identity actually conveys a deep truth, that Christ is, in the words of the hymn 'Praise to the Holiest in the Height', a second Adam tending the garden of God's creation to renew it and restore it as a second paradise. This year, the month of May is almost entirely in the season of Easter, which lasts until Pentecost (what used to be known as Whit Sunday), this year on 28th May. The Easter season celebrates Christ's resurrection, and the resurrection not only has something to say to us about our relationship with

God but also about our relationship with creation. It is not only our relationship with God which needs to be healed and restored, but also our relationship with the earth. And when I say the earth, I mean the actual earth of our gardens and fields as well as our planet, which takes its name from that earth.

And though you might not have seen an invitation to the Coronation, you may well have seen or will see the official emblem of the Coronation which also pays tribute to The King's love of the natural world. It includes amongst a crown, the flowers of the four nations of the United Kingdom: the rose of England, the thistle of Scotland, the daffodil of Wales and the shamrock of Northern Ireland. The emblem will feature throughout the celebrations in May, including the Coronation Service at Westminster Abbey and the Coronation Concert at Windsor Castle, as well as national events, street parties and community gatherings, not least our own ones here in the Windmill United Benefice.

In the words of the designer:

The design was inspired by King Charles' love of the planet, nature, and his deep concern for the natural world. The emblem speaks to the happy optimism of spring and celebrates the beginning of this new Carolean era for the United Kingdom.



And on that note of the happy optimism of spring and a new era for us all, I wish you a continuing Happy Easter and a Happy New Carolean Era!

NATURE WATCH

pring seems to have started earlier than ever this year. Was it last year's drought, the driest February on record, or the wettest March for a couple of decades? The answer is almost certainly the effect of climate change. I saw the first bluebells in flower on a bank along the bridleway section at the top end of Wilmots Lane, and a comma butterfly in the garden, both before the end of March, with more comma sightings in the first week of April when Yvonne spotted a peacock butterfly. Bluebells are really starting to show at the time of writing and will be in their full bewitching-blue glory by the third week of April. In the meantime, there has been an explosion of wild flowers during the first half of the month. Woods have been carpeted with white drifts of wood anemones; blue violets peep out from their foliage on the edge of pathways; the glittering golden stars of lesser celandines are putting on the best show I have ever seen and primroses seem to be everywhere.

There are both red and white dead nettles, the purple/blue flowers of ground ivy and the delicate pink blooms of lady's smock. There have been a number of spots in the village where the sheer numbers and or the variety of flowers have been glorious, such as the Common at the top corner of Millers Lane, the sea of celandine close to Wattlelands, also on Millers Lane and the dense patches of flowers along Prince of Wales Road



Trees and shrubs have broken into leaf in a multitude of shades of green. Blackthorns were the first to blossom and next the wild cherry trees, aka geans, that produced their white flowers in mid-April, just as the storm Noa hit the UK, leaving the woodland floor covered in what looked at first sight like confetti.

The Royal Society for the Protection of Birds has released the results of their annual Big Garden Birdwatch survey, now in its 44th year, with a record number of over half a million reports. The top ten show little change from last year, with the house sparrow in the top spot, the blue tit in second position for the third year running, the starling at number three, the woodpigeon at number four with numbers on the increase, followed by the blackbird in the fifth spot nationally but coming in at number nine in Surrey. Similarly, the long-tailed tit was in 10th position nationally but 12th in Surrey and these figures support my own observations of fewer sightings of these two birds and wrens in the garden over the last couple of years. Filling in the gaps in the top ten were the robin in 6th goldfinch 7th and great tit 9th. An interesting fact to emerge was the position of the hawfinch, sightings of which were reported by Jean Bristow back in November. It was ranked at 70 nationally and 63rd in Surrey. The results of this survey clearly demonstrate the overall decline in bird populations, although a few species are on the increase, but they should be set against the global picture, which shows that 49% of species are in decline. We all need to do as much as we can to support our wild birds, such as cutting down on pesticides, providing feeding stations particularly in winter months and follow David Attenborough's advice to fit a bell to cat collars.

This Month's Outwood News contains a gift of wildflower seeds for you to plant as a memento of the coronation of King Charles III. Each envelope contains a mixture of native wildflower seeds including corncockle, teasel, cornflower and sunflower. Simply remove any large stones and weeds, dig over the soil, scatter the seeds, firm them down, water gently and frequently. The inner envelope can be composted or put into food waste bins.
