BISHOP'S BURBLINGS

What's in a name?

A quote from Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, where

Juliet (a member of the Capulet family, avowed enemies of the Montague family) declares that a name is an artificial and meaningless convention, and that she loves the person who is called "Montague", not the Montague name and not the Montague family. The quote encapsulates the central struggle and tragedy of the play, and is one of Shakespeare's most famous quotes.



Are names a meaningless convention?

Names do have a meaning - my own seemingly is of Greek origin from 'Stefano', meaning "Crown". Probably quite apt, as I am sure there were plenty of occasions growing up when my Mother would have gladly "crowned" me!

For Mary Magdalene, her name becomes hugely significant. Standing alone and overcome in front of the empty tomb on that first Easter morning, she hears a familiar word, but spoken in very unfamiliar circumstances.

Mary!

In that one word, Mary receives all the hope and certainty and joy that she could ever imagine, especially on that most dreadful of days when she believed that the body of Jesus, her friend and Lord - which only three days previously had been laid to rest in the tomb- had been taken away to an unknown place.

Mary!

No, this was not the use of an artificial and meaningless convention, but a name truly spoken in love. A name spoken with so much meaning and purpose behind it, that it would lead to Mary rushing back to tell the other disciples who were hiding in their own fear and trepidation, that Jesus was alive! It was that one word, the name Mary, that helped lead the birth of the Christian Church - a Church that itself takes its name from Christ himself, a name that has been so revered for millennia since. But a name which sadly is also used by some so easily as a form of oath or detriment. A name both hallowed and disregarded.

I notice sometimes at funerals that people can be wary of speaking out loud the name of the deceased in fear of perhaps being reminded of, or reminding others of, the person who is no longer with us. Most people tend to talk about death by naming the relationship. "My dad died", "my cousin died", "my wife died". Giving the griever the opportunity to say the name of their loved one out loud is a very powerful gift. One of the heartaches and fears for a grieving person is that their loved one will be forgotten. But, by using the name out loud, we are surely honouring the life and name that was once lived.

That is why I think that it is so important when conducting a funeral to use the name of the deceased as much as possible and even using their name specifically in prayers and the Committal Service. The name and spirit live on in hearts and minds.

When my Father died some 30 years ago, my Mother was embarrassed to tell my brother and I that she would speak to "Peter" of an evening, telling him of her day and the news of the family. For Mum, speaking my Dad's name, out loud, was important to her and of great comfort. I am aware from other widows and widowers that I have spoken to that they too take comfort from speaking out loud to their loved one, and despite their embarrassment, I encourage them to continue - for there should be no name unspoken.

Whilst writing this Burbling, I have become aware as to how little I actually use my wife's name when talking to her. I guess that living in a house with just the two of you, when you speak out, it can only be to the other person in the house – unless I'm shouting at the clearly biased referee officiating at the match on the tv!

Maybe we should all become a little more sensitive to calling people by name when greeting them and talking to them - as with Mary, we never know how much that person may appreciate and value their name being said out loud. It might be, for them, the first time they have heard their name being out loud for a while.

Talking of names, Nicholas and Judith Calver, erstwhile Rector of this Benefice, have settled well into their new surroundings of Edenbridge. And whilst their names are perhaps being spoken out loud less, as time progresses, it does not mean that they are out of hearts and minds and remembered fondly. Interviews for the new Rector take place on 30th April and so we pray, God willing, that a new name will soon be spoken of and read in these pages and parishes.

This month we chased away the April showers in our meeting with music and laughter. Our visiting speaker was Debbie Lewington – a longtime associate of the Peggy Spencer academies – who treated us to a lively presentation about the history of ballroom dancing. NATURE WATCH

 \frown ince the beginning of the year the weather has been setting records, not just in the UK but around the world. In mid-April, Dubai had a year's rainfall in a day. Back at home the rain began to ease by the start of the third week of April but didn't stop completely. Conditions were generally better with a little more sunshine but accompanied by heavy showers and strong, cold northerly winds, which literally shredded new leaves from the tree tops. Meanwhile, bluebells began to appear in early April and by the middle of the month were putting on a real show. Interestingly, although we all appreciate the gorgeous shade of bluebell blue, they are very occasionally white or pink. The white variant can be seen in various spots in local woodland but I've only ever seen the pink in one place - on the common, just off the top corner of Millers Lane - mixed in with the blue and white versions, firstly back in 2012 and it is still there today.



In early April, Christine and John Mankelow kindly invited me, as their guest, to the AGM of The Royal Horticultural Society - Fruit Group at Wisley. A short time spent on business was followed by two speakers - one spoke about the importance of Sussex apple varieties in the national list - and the other gave a fascinating presentation on the subject of earthworms. Firstly, I had no idea there are over 3,000 species worldwide and 27 in the UK that are divided into three groups. The Epigeic group is comprised of small worms, bright red in colour, typically found in compost heaps and referred to as wrigglers. Endogeic worms are found in the surface layer of the soil, and the Anecic group contains the largest worms, including our common earthworm (*Lumbricus terrestris*) that we would all recognise, reddish brown in colour it burrows deeply, up to 2 metres, and produces worm casts, which are rich in soil nutrients essential to plants and fungal organisms. All worms are hermaphrodite and create cocoons, which take three years to mature resulting in two hatchlings. Earthworms are the key to soil ecology creating drainage, introducing oxygen and recycling decaying plant waste to make chemicals available to plants and fungi and are best described as eco engineers.

I was talking with Andy Wright, about how much of nature was ahead of itself this year, and as an example he said frogs, in his ponds, had already produced spawn, hatched into tadpoles, developed into froglets and that this year's cycle was now complete. I've seen a couple of frogs in our pond but no spawn. He also reported that after first recording one on his land in 2023 he had once again been hearing the nightingale's beautiful song since mid-April. This would be a male, probably the same one from last year, hoping to attract a passing female. Nightingales spend their winters in the humid conditions of West Africa and return to the UK in April and sing through April into May. Andy also mentioned that ravens were continuing to be regular visitors. Another report came from Lyn Wilson who said the first swallow of the season had arrived at her barn on Rookswood Farm on 6th April, a second on the 7th and yet another on the 8th. She also told me that Jim Nicholson, at Burstow Park Farm had also reported swallows arriving. This is such good news against a background of a reduction in the UK population.


