BISHOPS BURBLINGS

A holy man was having a conversation with the Lord one day and said, "Lord, I would like to know what Heaven and Hell are like."

The Lord led the man to two doors, opening one of them and letting the man look in.



In the middle of the room was a large round table, on the middle of which was a large pot of stew which smelled delicious and made the man's mouth water. The people sitting around the table were thin and sickly, appearing to be famished. They were holding spoons with very long handles that were strapped to their arms and each found it possible to reach into the pot of stew and take a spoonful, but, because the handle was longer than their arms, they could not get the spoons back into their mouths...

The man shuddered at the sight of their misery and suffering.

The Lord said, "You have seen Hell. Endless cravings, left for all eternity." They went to the next room and opened the door. It was exactly the same as the first one, with a large round table and a pot of stew.

The people were quipped with the same long-handled spoons, but here the people were well nourished, laughing and talking.

The man said, "I don't understand."

"It is simple", said the Lord, "It requires but one skill. You see, they have learned to feed each other, while the greedy only think of themselves."

Thinking of others before yourself, and, working together as a unit, are virtues that we will be recalling and honouring as we mark the 80th Anniversary of the end of the war in Europe on May 8th 1945 - not the end of World War II itself of course, as tens of thousands of lives on all sides would continue to be lost over the following months until VJ Day on August 15th.

People on every side, Allied or Axis, served in the various armed forces and civilian sections in order to protect the lives and futures of others, whilst laying down, in an act of ultimate sacrifice, their own lives and futures.

Total strangers, men and women, young and old, came together as comrades in a variety of guises - divisions, battalions, squadrons, fleets, commands - and bonded in order to form highly efficient, tightly bound, and fiercely loyal units, looking out for each other and sworn to protect and honour one another at all costs. They learned to look out for one another and to sacrifice "self".

Throughout history, countless accounts relate courageous acts of bravery, selflessness and compassion, as comrades, friends and strangers laid down and sacrificed their lives for the sake and benefit of others. Not only in time of war, but across all aspects of life and situations. Whilst many such instances are recorded, there are also far more numerous incidents that are unheralded and scarcely, if at all, known about.

The greatest and most important act of sacrifice and selflessness was of course shown by Christ, as he lay down his life on the cross of crucifixion - the most barbarous form of execution at that time. An act of utter compassion and benefice so that you and I might be rescued from the deserved judgement of eternal death, and receive instead, the mercy of life eternal. That promise of life eternal was what we celebrated recently at Easter and which we are called to continue to give thanks for, and celebrate, every day of our lives.

How do we celebrate that sacrifice? Not just by coming along to one of the 3 churches in the Windmill United Benefice, but also by how we live out our lives in service and honour to others.

All around us, wherever we live, work or play, we will find those who are in need. A need that is not only financial. Many people need assistance in their daily lives - companionship; a lift to the shops, doctor's surgery or other medical and health appointments; helping put the bins out; odd jobs around the house or garden.

For most of us, we will never have to lay down our lives in sacrifice for others, but we are all called to lay aside some time to help those around us and to be good neighbours and friends.

As we begin to shed the cocoons of Winter and welcome the joy and splendour of Summer, may we each of us try and bring some joy and splendour into the life of someone around us, and serve them however we can. Let us learn to help each other and not think only of ourselves.

NATURE WATCH

s Rogers and Hammerstein put it in their musical Carousel "Spring is bustin out all over". March and April produced almost non-stop sunshine with warm days, low night temperatures and very, very little rain and the result - the natural world has been racing ahead. Last month I mentioned how well primroses had done this year but it has been true of most wild flowers, they have appeared earlier than usual, profusely and the sunshine has ensured the blooms have kept fully open instead of closing on dull days. Dandelions in particular have put on a superb display and will be perfectly ready for the country tradition of making wine on St George's Day, Wednesday 23rd April, which celebrates his martyrdom in AD 303 for refusing to renounce his

Christian faith. All parts of the plant are edible and it has a number of health benefits including lowering blood sugar and having a diuretic effect. If it wasn't so successful, treated as a weed and was rare we would all be fighting to have it in our gardens. Many different species such as the white dead nettle, its relative with yellow hooded flowers the beautiful archangel and the pale pink lady's smock aka the cuckoo flower (*Cardine pratensis*) have all shown their colours early. However, bluebells have been the star of the show, during the last half of April, carpeting the woods with their magical blue tone and such a sweet unmistakeable scent. Trees have seemingly rushed into leaf and flowers giving us lots of high pollen warnings and for those afflicted – lots of sneezing. Hawthorns started to come into flower in the third week of April contrary to its old country name of May blossom. In gardens snowdrop were followed by



their cousins the spring snowflakes, then daffodils, which were swiftly followed by tulips. Trees and shrubs were also early in flower including camellias, magnolias, azaleas and lilacs and even our snowball bush (*Viburnham opulus*) will be sporting its white pom poms before the end of the month.

Butterflies also began some early appearances in the first week of April. My first sighting was of theorangey brown scalloped wing comma and then the orange tip, followed by a number of cabbage whites and a red admiral. Sylvia Maiklem and Andy Wright both reported seeing the pale limey yellow brimstone butterfly. Interestingly, I noticed that sightings stopped suddenly as soon as a spell of strong cold winds started mid-month. Squirrels have in the main kept themselves out of sight, busily looking after their broods whilst similarly birds have been working flat out catching food to feed their ever- demanding chicks.

Other reports this month have included one from Lyn Wilson who once again has kindly given details of the early arrival of swallows that have been summer visitors to her barn over many years. The first two arrived in the first week of April compared with the norm of mid-month. Andy Wright also reported the arrival of yet another regular visitor to Outwood - a nightingale that arrived back from its winter quarters in Africa in the second week of April and has been singing regularly. It is the male that sings in order to attract a mate and the female is mute. Debbie Hubbard reported another early riser in the shape of a young grass snake, My particular joy this spring has been hearing a cuckoo in the late afternoon on Good Friday whilst in the garden with Yvonne– lets hope it stays local instead of just passing through.



As the clocks moved forward in April and we started to enjoy the fruits of spring, there has been plenty happening both locally and nationally.

In Godstone, we are glad to receive the long-awaited news that most families evacuated from their homes have been given the green light to return home. We know that this situation has been incredibly distressing for the families who have been evacuated, but this milestone marks a positive step forward. As repairs continue, we hope those returning can begin to resettle and return to normal.

Last month, we visited St Mary's in Oxted to receive an update on the restoration of this wonderful church, which dates back to the 12th century. Following the Government's initial refusal to extend the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme, we wanted to understand what more could be done to support St Mary's – which is the only place of worship in East Surrey listed as 'at risk' by Heritage England. St Mary's has an exceptional fundraising team; their last campaign enabled them to renovate the top section of the tower, but the lower half remains vulnerable. During our visit, we discussed how St Mary's could increase their fundraising and explore wider uses of the space. With spring and summer approaching, they are also planning even more community events, so please visit their website to see what is coming up and help with their fundraising efforts.

The spring weather thankfully held out for the Lingfield Farmers' Market, bathing the event in some welcome sunshine. A huge well done to Alexia Lescure for organising such a lovely day.

In an update on Claire's rail survey, after weeks of raising residents' concerns with GTR and Network Rail, we are pleased to share that from December, the East Grinstead line will return to pre-COVID service levels. We are also continuing to push for the return of the direct services from Caterham to London Victoria. While GTR gave us some positive signals in our meeting, we will keep the pressure on to get this important service back.

There have also been some developments in local government reorganisation; the leaders of all twelve councils in Surrey have submitted their joint interim proposals to the Government. This sets out Surrey's intention to meet the Government's plans to abolish district/borough/county councils, in favour of unitary authorities and the introduction of elected mayors. The interim proposal outlines two options: Surrey County Council has recommended the creation of two unitary authorities, while most District and Borough Councils have put forward a model for three unitary authorities. In any case, the authorities will be split East to West. Following a response from the Local Government Minister, all local authorities in Surrey will have until the 9th of May to submit their final plans. A final decision from the Government is expected in the autumn. While the process is still in the early stages, Claire is keen to make sure that residents are able to have their say on the proposals. We will be working with other Surrey MPs to ensure residents have the opportunity to share their views.
