Rector's Ramblings

You may have already heard, but I shall be retiring at the turn of the year. My last service will be on Sunday 7th January (10am at St Mary the Virgin, Horne). Why am I retiring now? you might ask. Simply because (as I said when I made my retirement announcement in church), "I have a sense that my 35 years of ministry will have completed the chapter of my life as a stipendiary priest, *for everything there is a season and a time for every matter under the sun* and that there is a new chapter in my life which means, therefore, a new chapter in the life of the benefice."



The paragraph above mentions turning twice and my *For everything there is a season* quote comes from the the biblical book of Ecclesiastes, in which the writer reflects on the meaning of life. In the late 1950s Pete Seeger made a song out of that quote called *Turn! Turn! Turn! (To Everything There Is a Season)* made popular in the 1960s by the group The Byrds. During my 40 days' sabbatical in the Sinai desert back in 2014, I think I ended up a bit like the writer of Ecclesiastes as I sat in the sand and reflected on the meaning of life. One of the things I took away from the desert is a simple truth, which became for me one of the deepest truths, that we live in a turning world. As I sat and watched the sun, moon and stars appear to move across the sky I became more and more aware that it was not them that were moving but me. That I was living on a turning world. Day becomes night and night becomes day because the world turns, completing the circle every 24 hours. Turning is part of our existence. Turning brings life.

And as our thoughts turn to remembrance in this month of November, first with the All Souls service on 5th November and then Remembrance Sunday on 12th November, two special times when we remember those who have died, we are also reminded of turning. The poppy is the symbol of remembrance because in all the destruction of war, the artillery shelling turned the soil over and over and it was this turning that enabled the poppy seeds to germinate and flourish, an amazing sign of life in a place of so much loss. Many of us are also aware of more recent losses and these can be remembered at the All Souls service. I am very aware that every loss is different and words that comfort one person may not comfort another, but all this talk of turning has brought to mind a poem of comfort by Mary Hall (an American lawyer, suffragette and poet):

If I should die and leave you here a while, be not like others sore undone, who keep long vigil by the silent dust. For my sake turn again to life and smile, nerving thy heart and trembling hand

to do something to comfort other hearts than mine. Complete these dear unfinished tasks of mine and I perchance may therein comfort you.

That poem is about death and death is one of the most painful of losses. But we experience loss in all sorts of ways. As I approach retirement sometimes people ask me if I'm looking forward to it. And while the answer to that has to be yes, I am also aware that my retirement will also involve an experience of loss, not least a loss of what is in some ways part of my identity, who I am. I will miss being known by people, by you reading this. I will miss writing these Ramblings and the connections I make with people, with you, by writing them. I shall miss being a presence in the community. But I do so deeply know that, for everything there is a season, and I shall turn again to life, to a new chapter and a new season.

The Outwood WI group continue to expand (two new members at our last meeting) and we are adding social events to our healthy list of monthly clubs. A coffee morning at Haskins last month will be followed in October by a lunch date at Nutfield Priory.

Our October meeting was an open session and we were pleased to welcome several visitors both from other WI groups in the area and from local residents. Our planned presentation came from a group very close to the heart of our long term member Pat Hewett: her own life has been enriched because of the support of Canine Partners, a charity which aims to transform the lives of people with a range of disabilities - by providing them with a highly trained assistance dog.

After Pat's husband suffered a massive stroke twenty three years ago, she struggled to cope with the demands of his care until a chance reference on the radio led her to Canine Partners who have since supplied her family with dogs (including black labrador Yukon and the gorgeous golden retriever Beau who came to the meeting with her) who performs amazing support tasks for her husband including raising the alarm if he falls or needs the emergency services.

Yvonne Saunders, another member of the Canine Partners team, led the presentation describing the history of the organisation and showing photographs and fim demonstrating some of the many tasks these highly trained dogs perform: fetching items, carrying shopping, posting letters, opening cupboards, drawers and doors, hanging out washing, taking shoes and socks off human feet. We even watched the dogs collecting money from the cashpoint and switching onlights! Support dogs have been seen at Help for Heroes events, the Invictus Games, university degree ceremonies - they have even acted as ball collectors at Wimbledon!

It is not surprising that it costs a lot of money to train the dogs to this fantastic level: £30,000 is need for each animal. We were very happy to make a contribution to this charity - as well as buying some of the doggy products - and it was a truly heart-warming afternoon.

NATURE WATCH

The warm weather of September continued into mid-October when the winds veered first to south westerlies, bringing some much-needed rain, and then to north easterlies giving us the first frost of the season, just enough to singe the petals of some of the more tender garden flowers, and a sign that winter is just round the corner. A mere two days earlier the mercury was at 22°. It was also a useful reminder to me to start moving my frost tender potted flowers into the greenhouse after getting caught out by the early frosts last year, which resulted in the loss of a number of choice plants.

The late burst of summer conditions proved to be a boon for some butterflies such as large and small whites, peacocks and especially red admirals, which I've seen in abundance. The annual Big Butterfly Count now in its thirteenth year, which ran from mid-July to 6th August, showed that numbers had improved on the all-time low of 2022 with the average number of butterflies seen on each count increasing from 9 to 12, which was attributed to the mixed weather this year compared with the drought conditions of 2022. The standout was the red admiral that had increased by 360% year on year, followed by the gatekeeper and the large white. Despite these improvements the facts are that overall, species continue to be in decline as a result of habitat loss and climate change.

In September Andy Wright reported a couple of unusual sightings the first of which was a buzzard, not unusual in itself, but this one certainly exhibited some strange behaviour. Andy spotted the bird when it attacked one of his chickens. The second was the sighting of a common raven (Corvus corax), which was on the ground, hopping from one mole-hill to another making a warbling croak. They are an unusual sight locally although I used to spot one occasionally, worm hunting on the back fields among a flock of rooks and standing out like a sore thumb because of its sheer size. The common raven is the largest member of the crow family, which is distributed across the northern hemisphere favouring mountainous and wooded, rural areas. They weigh between 2-3.5lbs larger than a buzzard - and have a wingspan of 1.3 metres. In the wild they live for between 10-15 years but they have been known to survive for 25 years in captivity. Their diet is varied comprising insects, nuts, grains, berries, carrion, worms and mammals up to the size of lambs. When young they collect together in small groups and can often be seen showing off their excellent acrobatic abilities but as they mature, they pair off and mate for life. Along with other members of the crow family they are very intelligent and their brain to body ratio is only slightly less than humans. So perhaps it is no surprise that they are excellent mimics, particularly of the human voice, and experts suggest they are better than parrots. They also have other surprising abilities. They recognise faces and if they are upset by another raven, or animal, they can hold a grudge for some time. They gesture to communicate by pointing their beaks and yet another facility is their ability to construct tools. In folklore, across their territories, they are known to be tricky and devious and this is perhaps why collective nouns for ravens include a treachery and an unkindness.

Collection vehicle fire caused by lithium battery

We would like to remind residents not to put batteries in your rubbish or recycling bin. Recently, a lithium battery in one of the collection vehicles caused a fire, prompting the fire services to respond and affecting our collection service.

The cost to repair the vehicle, which is still in the garage, is over £17,000.

Batteries, as well as gas canisters and helium tanks can explode and cause a fire inside the vehicle. This also creates a risk to the safety of the collection crew and the fire service.

To dispose of:

- Batteries, including e-cigarette batteries put them in a small, tied sandwich bag next to your bin on your collection day. Your local community recycling centre and supermarkets also accept them.
- Small electrical appliances and power tool batteries put them in a tied carrier bag next to your bin on your collection day.
- Gas canisters and helium tanks make sure it is completely empty and contact the shop or supplier you bought it from to find out if they will take it back or take it to your community recycling.

POLICE STATION

When the use of Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) in school construction hit the headlines in September, the police began proactively assessing our buildings for the presence of RAAC.

Following a structural engineer's assessment it was confirmed that RAAC was used in parts of the construction at Reigate Police Station.

"The health and safety of our officers, staff and visitors to our buildings is of paramount importance, and where we are unable to install Acrow-props (a vertical support system which is used to support overhead loads) we must relocate teams, and services, either within the building, to other police sites, or to work remotely".

The public-facing front counter at Reigate police station is in an area of the building where we cannot install the required propping support, and so will be relocated from the 30th October to Caterham police station (CR3 6LD).

This will ensure that the public can continue to report crime and speak to us in person - our opening hours will remain the same, 08:00 - 22:00 seven days a week excluding Christmas Day.

We wish to reassure you that Reigate & Banstead's local Neighbourhood Policing Teams, who spend much of their time away from the police station patrolling and responding to 999 emergency calls, will remain based at the police station maintaining our local policing presence.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused by this relocation due to health and safety concerns.

Dear friends, neighbours and fellow Outwood residents,

Last New year my poor pony Talullah suffered and died a horrendously painful death as a direct result of fireworks being let off close by in Outwood.

As we approach the winter and fireworks season, I am writing to ask you to consider attending an organised public display such as the one at The Bell, rather than having fireworks at home.



I for one feel privileged to live in a beautiful rural village surrounded by animals and wildlife.

"The Animal Welfare Act 2006 states it is an offence to cause any unnecessary suffering to any captive or domestic animal. Government advice is – Fireworks must not be set off near livestock or horses in fields or close to buildings housing livestock". The offence carries a fine of up to £20,000 and/or a prison term of up to six months.

I know fireworks are a contentious issue and I fully appreciate that many people will want to celebrate with fireworks, but please instead consider an organised insured public display, or have a display that uses quiet fireworks.
