CHURCH NEWS

BISHOPS BURBLINGS

We are now entering a time of year when we look both back and forwards.

Back, as we lovingly recall those we have known who have gone before us, and remember with gratitude those who gave up their lives for the benefit of others.



Firstly, at St Bartholomew Church, Burstow, on Sunday 2nd November at 4pm, we will be holding our annual All Souls Service, where we remember and give thanks for those whom we have loved, but see no longer. Your loved one may have died recently, or 20+ years ago. Regardless, of the time past, please do join with us for this special service, during which there will be an opportunity for the name of your loved one(s) to be read out, and to light a candle in their memory.

Secondly, on Sunday 9th November, we will remember those who died during the 2 World Wars, and other conflicts since then where lives have been lost. With, at the time of writing, great hope for a final peaceful resolution to the acts of violence, terrorism and bloodshed in Gaza, as well as a ceasefire in the Ukraine, we come together to pray for peace in our troubled and divided world and to remember those gave up their lives for the sake of others, or who were caught up in war or violence.

Acts of Remembrance will be held at each of the 3 churches of the Windmill United Benefice - details of times can be found elsewhere in this magazine. Again, please do join with us, as we recall and remember those who gave up their todays for our tomorrows

In addition, an Act of Remembrance will be held on Armistice Day itself, 11th November, starting at 10.45, at the War Memorial in the churchyard at 5t Mary's, Horne – all are very welcome.

Sunday 16th November is The World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Accidents.

Initiated in 1993 by RoadPeace, it was established in response to the lack of public recognition for road crash victims, who, unlike victims of crime, disaster, or war, had not been offered a designated remembrance day. With the support of the United Nations, the day, which is now observed in countries in every continent of the world, quickly garnered international support and serves as a public acknowledgment of the devastating impact road deaths and injuries have on victims, their families and communities.

Road deaths are not 'normal' deaths - They are violent, sudden and premature, creating a deep trauma that affects families, friends and communities. Worldwide, nearly 4,000 people are killed every day in road crashes, and hundreds of thousands more are injured. The emotional and psychological impact on survivors and the bereaved is never-ending.

It is also seen as a day to commend the vital work of those involved in the aftermath of a crash – including fire, police and ambulance teams, doctors, nurses and counsellors.

CHURCH NEWS

The 12th of November marks the 60th anniversary of the tragic deaths of 3 Smallfield schoolboys on their way home from school. The 3 friends, David Cain, Richard Shepperd and Allan Hodkinson, aged 11, pupils at Reigate Grammar School, were killed by a car which struck them as they were crossing Doversgreen Road, Reigate. They were members of the 7th Horley (Burstow) scout troop, and were known to current members of the three Windmill Churches. The driver of the car, was subsequently found not guilty of causing the deaths of the 3 boys, but was found guilty of dangerous driving.

These deaths came just a day after a 17 years old boy, Ian Brodie, also from Smallfield, and an ex-pupil of Reigate Grammar School, was involved in a road accident whilst driving his motor-cycle.

In May 2003, 13 years old Stephanie Gibson suffered severe head injuries as she crossed Weatherhill Road in Smallfield, and died a few days later of her injuries.

In October 2009, 20 years old Amie Etherington, again from Smallfield, was killed after her car was involved in a collision with another car on the Balcombe Road, Pound Hill near the Parsons Pig pub. Her funeral was held at St Bartholomew Church. These six young people, together with others, will be remembered during the normal Sunday morning service at St Bartholomew's Burstow, on the 16th November.

As noted before, these events are violent and sudden and bring huge devastation to families and friends who are left to deal with the aftermath of such tragic incidents. As someone who almost lost his wife to a near fatal car crash on the M23, I am aware of the shock when you receive the phone call from the emergency services informing you of the accident and advising you to get to the hospital as quickly as possible. Even so, I cannot imagine the heartbreak suffered when the loss of life occurs of a loved one, especially those of a young age, as is the case in many of the foregoing stories.

We look forward to welcoming you to the churches of the Windmill United Benefice for all or any of the services as we remember together those whom we have loved but see no more, and for those whose sacrifice has enabled us to live in freedom.

At the end of November, we enter into the season of Advent as we wait and prepare for both the celebration of Jesus's birth at Christmas and the return of Christ at the Second Coming. It is a time of rejoicing for the past, and hope for a future where there will no longer be tears and sorrows, but joy and happiness.

Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; from our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in the thee.

NATURE WATCH

Ithough we have had some rain since the end of the three-month drought during the summer in this corner of the country, we've been limited to little more than a few periods of overnight rain and the odd shower. However, it still came as some surprise to hear that in early October, South East Water announced that Ardingly Reservoir, created in 1978, had a mere six weeks supply of water left as television pictures confirmed and the solution to the problem was to draw water from the River Ouse. But from mid-October the picture started to change and the wind direction from the east veered back to our prevailing westerlies bringing rain to fill the dry ponds. The changing colours and falling leaves that signalled an early start to autumn, back in August, gathered pace as temperatures began to drop. Roe deer sightings became more numerous as reported by Alison from the old school who said she was regularly encountering roe bucks on the common that came quite close to her.

One of the pleasures of living in a village like Outwood is the proximity of so many different country walks and the drier days of early October were perfect for kicking the leaves on a woodland ramble, particularly along the new network of pathways between St John's church and the cricket club that, as many people will have discovered, have been the subject of major improvement. The National Trust have been talking about creating a network of connected pathways for the last few years but maybe due to various personnel changes or the usual lack of budget there was no progress. But rescue was at hand when Paul Howard, one of the local trust volunteers, took the matter in hand and was successful in raising loan funds to cover the cost of the work. Despite a few corrugations in places, the new network is judged to be a great success. It will allow everyone to walk through this woodland area throughout the year avoiding the Wealden clay and large puddles of the past and this includes me as one who can now use my mobility scooter to walk Tess - a big thank you.

As the temperatures start to drop and the days get shorter fungi have been springing out everywhere. Once again it is back to the woods where fungi, that have been at work underground all year, suddenly push up the fruiting bodies that produce their spores. Bracket fungi such as the white Birch polypore, Artist's fungus or the colourful striped Turkey tail, Shaggy inkcap, Bluet, Chicken of the woods and on and on they go mostly with unpronounceable Latin names. Their ecological role is to recycle nutrients from dead plant material but also in many cases they form mycorrhizal partnerships with trees and other plants. One very common example is Honey fungus (*Armillaria*



mellea), which can be seen, usually in large patches of honey-coloured individuals, darkening with age, closely packed together along woodland paths and around tree stumps, especially those left as a result of the felling of trees subject to ash dieback. Apart from its benefits Honey fungus acts as a pathogen of trees and shrubs and can strike at any time and I recall Brian Hibbard, retired woodman for the National Trust, once saying - you can't get rid of it is all around us in the countryside.

To finish on a surprising announcement from The Tree Register, which has named the one-time garden hedge favourite The Leylandii x (*Hesperotropsis leylandii*) as their Tree of the Year – a tree with the talent to be in the wrong place at the wrong time.





I hope you all had a fantastic October.

I visited Manchester at the start of the month for the Conservative Party Conference.

We announced a flurry of policies, including commitments to abolishing stamp duty and business rates for high street shops if we were to win the next election.

In my area of energy, I will be campaigning to cut the cost of electricity by 20 percent – something that could be done tomorrow by making two changes that are entirely in the hands of Ministers.

Back at home, the conference recess allowed me to step back from Westminster and soak up the history, heritage and beauty of East Surrey's towns and villages. From Outwood's iconic windmill to Crowhurst's Yew Tree, our little patch of England is steeped in heritage. We should be proud of where we came from, and no one should tell us otherwise. In the run-up to Christmas, I will be exploring and sharing East Surrey's history, from well-known stories to the hidden gems. If you know of any spots of historical magic, please share them with me on claire.coutinho.mp@parliament.uk and I will add it to my list of places to visit.

A sacrosanct part of our heritage are East Surrey's brilliant pubs, restaurants and hospitality venues. As one publican said to me recently, our pubs are the nation's living rooms, another home from home. I was pleased to welcome many of East Surrey's businesses to my hospitality roundtable in September. It has been a tough year for the sector: a hike in tax, new employment regulations, stubbornly high inflation and rising energy bills. The Hare & Hound, where we held the roundtable, is more than 400 years old. To lose these places would be to tear a chapter out of our local heritage. With the concerns raised, I will be writing to the Chancellor ahead of her next budget.

As a self-confessed community centre superfan, I was thrilled to be invited to officially open The Mast Park Pavilion in Oxted last month. I cannot tell you how few things I have actually seen built in my six years as an MP. The new community hub at Master Park is a tribute to the passion of Pammy McNaughton and all the Trustees and donors who made it happen through their mammoth fundraising efforts. Praise must also go to Surrey County Councillor Cameron McIntosh for his support, and the brilliant Titsey brewery, who are running the bar. Community spaces like these can do wonders for our sense of belonging and wellbeing. I look forward to the joy it will bring to residents in the years ahead. Huge well done all!

For residents of Godstone and Bletchingley, the High Street collapse continues to cause knock-on issues – one of them being the volume of traffic now zipping through previously quiet roads, with Eastbourne Road bearing the brunt of the diversion. I met with homeowners to discuss what can be done to ease the pressure. One possibility was to temporarily reduce the speed limit; unfortunately, this idea was rejected by Surrey County Council when I approached them, citing a lack of evidence of speeding. I am now working with residents to set up a Community Speedwatch. This initiative has seen huge success in Oxted, so I hope the benefits can be mirrored here too.

I have also been charging ahead with my Bletchingley water pressure campaign. The overwhelming request from residents has been for a water station to be set up. I have been pushing SES Water to deliver this, but it has been really frustrating that they have been refusing my requests to do so. I took it right to the top and wrote to their Chief Executive. As has become the norm with my communications with SES Water, the response was total garbage. I will now be writing to the regulator, Ofwat, as the situation has become completely unacceptable.
