

#### JOAN WELLS 1923-2023



Joan's early childhood was spent in Bournemouth, Dorset. On leaving school she joined the Air Force as a WAAF Special Duties Clerk. She was stationed in Somerset and Stanmore, plotting enemy aircraft and buzz bombs. At the end of the war Joan completed an interior design course at Bournemouth School of Art and subsequently became an apprentice at Heal & Sons in Tottenham Court Road.

Joan lived in Outwood since 1968 when she married Ray Wells of Hook House Farm.

She very much enjoyed the country life. As well as being a farmer's wife she was a keen gardener, artist, needlewoman, bee keeper and in recent years was one of Outwood Woodcarvers stalwart carvers. She was a keen supporter of the Woodland Trust and was very proud to have planted over 30 trees in her gardens. Joan designed the Outwood sign on the common. She unveiled the refurbished sign at the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee celebration held on Outwood Common on 3rd June 2022.

On 14th May this year Joan celebrated her 100th birthday surrounded by her family and friends. It was a very special occasion.

As a family, we would like to thank *everyone* who made it possible for Joan to remain independent and enjoy living at Path End.

#### **Rector's Ramblings**

You may or may not remember but back in July I wrote about my tomatoes. I said how I had 49 plants and then went on to say how they were good for my soul and, closely connected to that, my mental health. I said how tending them was a way of connecting to nature, and also something that enabled me to switch off, to be in the moment with all my attention, not thinking or worrying – a spiritual reboot as I called it. I encouraged you to think of something that played a similar role in yourself.



Anyway, since then I have discovered that 49 tomato plants produce a great deal of tomatoes. Kilos and kilos of them. Though blight got to some of them in the end, I have managed to fill the freezer with quantities of tomato puree which will see us through the winter. The harvest is safely gathered in. (Though not even the blighted ones are wasted. They fell to the ground where the seeds contained in them will sprout next year bringing an unexpected bonus of an unplanned future crop).

And talking of harvest, a couple of my tomatoes made an appearance at the Harvest Festival at St John the Baptist last month (as some others of mine had put in an appearance at the Outwood Show – though no prizes for me!). For Harvest Festival I brought along one large beef tomato and one small cherry tomato (both saved from the roasting and puréeing process). I said in my sermon how harvest is not just about gathering in but also about sharing, about giving as well as getting. And then I said that from a spiritual point of view what matters is not how much we give compared to others but what our giving represents for us. I reminded people of Jesus' parable of the "widow's mite" in which rich people donated large sums to the temple and a poor widow put in the equivalent of two pence. The poor widow, said Jesus, put it more than anyone because it represented all that she had.

I said how the rich people in the parable are a bit like my big tomato with plenty of seeds to give and the poor widow like my cherry tomato with far fewer seeds to give. But God does not look on the outside. God looks at the heart. What matters in God's eyes is how generous we are with what we have. And generosity is about much more than giving money to good causes, important as that is.

Generosity is also very much about the giving of acts of kindness and however big or small our acts of kindness are, what matters is the spirit in which they are given. Are we generous spirited in all our sharing with others?

I ended my sermon by saying that I would like to leave the congregation with my tomato motto, first asking them how you get a motto from tomato. Do you know how? With my visual aid of six big letters spelling the word 'tomato' I moved the o, the m and the a to the front and ended up with 'a motto'! And then I finished with my tomato motto. On the internet it's attributed to Winston Churchill and though he never in fact said it, it doesn't stop me liking it:

We make a living by what we get; we make a life by what we give.

I'd like to leave my tomato motto with you, too. And perhaps whenever you see a tomato it will come back to you – like a seed planted in the soil of your heart.

#### **NATURE WATCH**

utumn is coming early. I first spotted hawthorn hips beginning to show colour in early July and leaves of various trees and shrubs starting to change colour in early September. There is no doubt the weather, or more accurately climate, is like the jet stream changing tack and as we all have seen the seasons are in a bit of a mess. Since writing last back in July we've had one of the dullest August's on record with very little sunshine coupled with lower-than-average temperatures but little or no rain. Then as though to reward our patience September arrived and with it a big change for the better with blue skies, plenty of sunshine and temperatures more akin to the Mediterranean. What a pleasure, a last gasp of summer. The mercury hit 32C in the shade in the garden for a few days and according to weather news reports Wisley managed a blistering 36C. In such conditions it is easy enough at home to meet the water needs of greenhouse and salad crops but out in the countryside the combination of very dry soil conditions coupled with high temperatures resulted in many more trees taking on autumn tones and some shedding their leaves. In particular, the ash trees already suffering from the die-back disease were prone to early leaf fall and are likely to die more quickly. However, the local hornbeams were also under heat stress and shed bunches of samaras - winged seeds - which formed pale green carpets across woodland bridleways as I found in the one at the top of Hornecourt Hill, but they will survive and hopefully new trees will fill-in the gaps left by the dead ash. Yet another response by plants to these hot and dry conditions has been to produce more seeds or fruit. Back in the garden our runner beans stopped flowering – great while they lasted - and one of the plum trees dropped most of its leaves. On a brighter note the chicory, which started flowering at the end of June, was still producing its azure blooms into mid-September. Meanwhile, the sunny warm weather continued for just over a fortnight before the westerly airstream took over, once again bringing some much-needed rainfall.

As we all know plants need the right soil to survive but some, such as rosebay willowherb (Chamaenarian augustifolium) aka fireweed and dialect names including Ranting Widow in Somerset and Blooming Sally in Hampshire, have one main preference. It has to be disturbed ground whether, scorched earth after fires, bombsites or garden flower borders It grows up to 2 metres, with narrow alternate leaves, underground stems and rosy pink flowers each of which produce a seed capsule containing up to 400 seeds and a single plant can produce upwards of 80,000 seeds, each with silky hairs that ensure good wind distribution, and they can remain viable in the soil for some years. The flowers are very attractive to insects including moths such as the elephant hawk moth. In the eighteenth century the plant was quite rare, however, just like ragwort, it rapidly spread across the country following the introduction of the railways. Despite being so common the Plantlife charity nominated rosebay willowherb in their 2002 County Flower of the Year competition as the flower of the year for London.

For those interested in our wild birds Andy Wright passed on news of an excellent app for bird identification for use on mobile phones called Merlin. Published by Cornell Lab part of Cornell University, this enables users to identify birds by photo or birdsong.



#### Gatwick Northern Runway Project application accepted by Planning Inspectorate

On 6 July Gatwick Airport Limited submitted its Northern Runway Project application to the Planning Inspectorate for development consent. Following a 28-day review, during which we were invited to submit an Adequacy of Consultation response (which can be viewed on the Planning Inspectorate's website), the Planning Inspectorate has accepted the application for detailed consideration and examination.

The Planning Inspectorate has now publicised the submission documents for the development consent order application and details of the public inquiry will follow in due course, with examination anticipated to begin in late November or December and due to last for six months. Following this the Planning Inspectorate will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State, who will decide whether development consent should be granted for the proposed scheme.
