NATURE WATCH

ODE TO AUTUMN

By John Keats

Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness Close bosom friend of the maturing sun Conspiring with him how to load and bless With fruit the vines that round the thatch eaves run.

hese first few lines of this beautiful poem, written on 19 September 1819, paint such a gloriously descriptive picture of autumn, probably never bettered. In just three verses John Keats describes autumn in such a lyrical and romantic way, capturing the essence of the season in each of its phases from the ripening of fruit and grain with golden stubble fields, to the pressing of cider, the cheerful whistling call of the robin redbreast and the gathering, before departure, of swallows. Returning home, after taking Tess for her walk, it was such a joy to read this poem, probably for the first time in some years. It so completely describes the scene of a typical sunny, autumn day, you can almost taste the stillness. Although stillness is not something we have seen much of over the last few weeks because, just like so much of our weather this year, many autumn days have been accompanied by strong, often gusty, winds. The result has been broken tree branches, fallen trees, particularly ash trees weakened by die-back, wind-fall fruit before ripening and garden flowers such as Michaelmas daisies and dahlias being blown over.

After the rain broke the drought in late July itdidn't last long, but in many places, it was just in time to plump-up the blackberries, some bushes were almost overfull. Alongside Church Walk they were so good I decided to pick some for a pie but where to put them. I fished my cap out of the basket on my scooter and very quickly filled it, fortunately not leaving much of a stain when it dried - I remembered to take a plastic jug the following day but it was just another week before as we used to say when I was young "they've got the devil's spit on them" – not worth eating.



Hawthorn herries

As Keats had written, fruit was ripening everywhere and the plants seem to have responded to the drought with a survival mechanism of producing bumper crops, with trees such as holly and hawthorn absolutely loaded with berries and horse chestnuts full of conkers, but a press report stated that the fruits were too small and the national conker competition was likely to be cancelled. Garden plums, damsons, apples and pears have also produced bumper crops. When the rain returned in September it began to penetrate deeper into the ground and moles responded with their heaps popping up over the lawn. I noticed that their tunnels were a lot deeper than usual and I think this has been due to the worms descending deeper into the soil during the drought and the moles had to tunnel deeper to find their food. As proof that reptiles such as frogs, newts and toads do not spend their whole lives in water I had a couple of sightings recently. One was along the bridleway from the top of Hornecourt Hill to Tile Barn, where on a dry and dusty surface I saw a small frog, which on sensing movement moved into grass but still some twenty metres from a damp ditch and then a replay the following day at exactly the same spot. The other was in early October. I was cleaning my teeth in the cloakroom near the back door when I caught sight of a small common toad hopping across the floor - I gathered it in a tissue and released it to find its way to a more suitable environment.







I introduced Claire Coutinho, our MP and Shadow Equality Minister, to the owner of Outwood Mill a week or so ago.



Gatwick Airport Route 4 history for Outwood

Alan Jones who represents OUR BURSTOW WARD on the Gatwick Airport consultative committee and is well-versed in the matters of noise and air traffic control, came to the last meeting of Outwood Parish Council

He updated us on the evolution of national air traffic and debates that are ongoing on across government and within the national traffic control and the civil aviation authority. It may be many years before there is a definitive conclusion and a lot of existing routing dates back to the mid-1950s and hasn't changed since then.

We are hopeful that Route 4 which specifically affects our village maybe decided more definitively within the next couple of years and this may give more specific direction for flights to travel along the specific line in the MAP below.

As an example IN THE MAP BELOW we were shown the flight directions of aircraft on August 10 2025 and you will see that aircraft fly over a wide area including many directly over the village.

At the moment all that our representatives can do is to make the various statutory bodies aware of the village concerns about noise pollution and disturbance.

There is a particular issue about aircraft that are more than 4000 feet above the ground at which point they are controlled by a different set of rules, as they are able to be vectored away by the air traffic control at Swanick, which are not within the route 4 criteria.

We are also affected by planes that are higher in the sky and orientated to other airports including Heathrow ,over which we have little control but we hope (maybe) definitively directed when they complete the overhaul of air traffic control arrangements for the south of England in the next five years ,as part of the future airspace implementation (FASI)

In the meantime as you can see from the attached map for ROUTE 4, flights fly as close as possible to follow the black line marked with an X so long as they are within 1.5 km sway either side of this line. However, you can see from the map some of vector Southwards and come therefore directly over the village.

We have made our position crystal clear, but I suspect that it will have little effect if any. If anybody has the ear of our member of parliament and can persuade her to take up the matter on our behalf by writing directly to the powers that be that may be very helpful.
