ALAN'S AMBLINGS



Dear Friends

I am delighted to be writing my first article in the magazine and to introduce myself to you as your new Rector. Rachel and I are looking forward to moving to Smallfield at the beginning of August and I to joining you as Rector of the Windmill Benefice in September. I wanted to use this opportunity to share some of my own faith and personal story and how I have ended up as your next Rector.

I grew up in a village near Swansea in South Wales called Penllergaer which is similar in size to Smallfield and was surrounded by farms and beautiful countryside. As a child, I attended St David's Church, which was at the heart of the community and enjoyed singing in the Choir and being a server on Sundays.

I enjoyed science at school and left Wales at the age of 18 to study physics at Imperial College in London. Initially, I began to doubt my childhood faith, believing that science made more sense of the world than religion and would have described myself as being agnostic at that time. However, while studying at Imperial College, I started attending the Anglican Chaplaincy and my Chaplain, who had a background in science, encouraged me to read and reflect more deeply on the relationship between science and religion. This helped me realise that it was possible to have a genuine Christian faith and to be open to the exciting discoveries about the universe that science was opening to me.

I went on to do research in astronomy and physics at UCL and, while there, I met Rachel who was studying Speech Sciences at the time.

We moved to Taunton in Somerset in 1985, where I worked as a Computer Consultant and Rachel as a Speech and Language Therapist. We got married at our local church and a year later our eldest son Jonathan was born. Shortly after this, I was made redundant and began to reflect more deeply on my life so far and what God might be saying to me through this period of change and uncertainty about my future. I became very friendly with the Curate at our church, and we would go for long walks in the Quantock Hills during which we would discuss faith, life and many other matters. I began to wonder whether or not God might be calling me to the Ordained Ministry. With his help and the encouragement of my Parish Priest, I began to explore this growing sense of vocation.

In the meantime, I started another job in a data centre in Bristol which led to a long dailycommute up and down the M5! However, that strong sense of calling wouldn't go away and a year later I gave up my job and we moved to Durham where I trained at Cranmer Hall for the Anglican Ministry at Cranmer Hall and our second son, Edward was born.

My first Curacy was served at St Mark's Church in Bournemouth where just over 30 years ago I was ordained as Priest. While living here our daughter Rhiannon was born.

We moved back to Durham in the later 1990's where I became a University Chaplain at the College of St Hild and St Bede and I was able pursue again my interest in science and religion and taught a number of courses on this topic.

However, I realised that the call to Parish Ministry was growing stronger and so in 2003, I moved back to Wales to be Vicar of a group of rural parishes to the north of Swansea in the area where I grew up and spent the next 13 years actively involved in the local community and helping to build up God's Kingdom in this place.

An opportunity then arose to go back into Chaplaincy work and so we moved to Croydon in 2016 where I became Chaplain at Whitgift School and an active member of the staff of Croydon Minster. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time ministering in Croydon at the school and in the wider community and have built up important links with local schools and community organisations.

Earlier this year, I began to feel again a strong calling back to Parish Ministry and went to see Archdeacon Moira to enquire about vacancies in the Diocese. She showed me a large map on the wall and pointed to an area at the southern end of the diocese. 'There are a group of 3 country parishes called the Windmill Benefice', she said, 'that are currently in vacancy and looking for a new Rector. This might be a place worth looking at'. I didn't know the area and had never heard of the Windmill Benefice at this point, however, as we talked it became very clear that this post was definitely worth exploring further.

I decided to apply for the post and was fortunate to be called for interview. As I arrived at the Church Hall in Outwood, flanked by Charles and Steve who had kindly showed me round the Benefice earlier in the day, Moira spotted me and said 'I see you're in good hands with a Sargeant and a Bishop looking after you!' I took this as a good omen for the rest of the day which did indeed turn out well. I was also pleased to discover that a previous Rector of Burstow was John Flamsteed, the first Astronomer Royal so the science and religion links which have been present throughout my life were here again with opportunities to develop these further.

From September, I will be joining you as the next Rector of the Windmill United Benefice and am really looking forward to getting to know you all and to help build up the work of God's Kingdom in this place.

I am intrigued by the logo of the Windmill Benefice which has the arms of the Outwood Windmill in the shape of a Cross inside a circle with the names of the 3 Parishes of St Bartholomew's Burstow, St John the Baptist Outwood and St Mary the Virgin Horne printed inside the circle.

This reminds me so much of the ringed Celtic Crosses that are so common across Wales with a cross inside a circle representing the Cross at the heart of the world. It speaks to me powerfully of the need for the Church to be present at the heart of the community bringing the love of God to everyone who is present in this place.

I want to thank the previous Rector, Nicholas and his wife Judith for the wonderful ministry they have shared with you since 2015 and the strong legacy that he has left. I hope and pray that I will prove to be a worthy successor. I also want to thank Charles, Steve and the Wardens for keeping everything running so smoothly during the interregnum and look forward to working with them all in the future.

I hope to get to know many of you throughout the community over the coming weeks and months and hope that some of you will be able to join me for my Induction service on 30th September.

On the Sunday before my induction, I am hoping to walk round the Benefice visiting and praying in the different churches and at other places in the community. I hope that some of you will be able to join me and will be posting more information about this in due course.

I want to end these words of welcome with a blessing based on the vision that has been developed for the Benefice and offer this as a prayer for my ministry among you:

May we seek to serve God in this community
Seven whole days not one in seven
May we inspire people through worship and word
To live out God's love in their daily lives
And may we welcome everyone into our midst
Through Christ our Lord.

NATURE WATCH

Climate, we do of course get a lot of change but this year certainly takes the biscuit. However, the problem is worldwide with record temperatures, rainfall and winds and there is no doubt climates are changing. Here in the UK the problem is linked to the movements of the jet stream, which this year has spent too much time lingering to the south of us leaving us on the wrong side of the good weather. June gave us little summer weather and July had 90% of the month's average rainfall in the first two weeks followed by a short burst of warm weather then back to more rain, leaving us with the hope of some summery days in the last week of the month. On the subject of temperatures, I found myself in conversation with Lauma (sorry didn't catch her surname) at the British Legion, garden party held at Wasp Green Farm. Lauma, who lives in Horne, told me she but was born in Riga in Latvia. Talking about climate changes she said that one advantage of their saunas was that, in the event of high temperature events, they could use their saunas to remain cool, because these buildings were so well insulated against the very low winter readings. Lauma then said it was not unusual to experience winter temperatures of minus 35° in Riga and minus 40° in Finland – we should be grateful for small mercies.

Recently, whilst taking Tess for her daily perambulation, thesmell of freshly cut grass was in the air as we passed Wasp Well on Millers Lane but Tess was much more interested in scenting the air for a squirrel she hadn't seen, that had darted across the lane in front of us. This got me thinking as to why she was able to ignore the all-pervading smell of the grass. A little research revealed some amazing facts. We all know that dogs have a better sense of smell than humans but better is a completely inadequate description. Humans have 6 million olfactory (smell) cells whilst dogs have between 150 and 300 million depending on breed and, their olfactory bulb, which analyses the in-coming nerve signals, is some forty times larger than that in humans relative to body size. Their wet noses enable them to attract more scent particles, they have excellent memories for scents and surprisingly they can scent in stereo because they can move their nostrils independently of each other, enabling them to detect two different smells as well as

the direction of the source of the smell. This super sense enables us to train them to detect people, drugs, lost property, explosives, a wide range of diseases such as cancer and diabetes and changes in human emotions and impending attacks.

In a recent conversation with Paul Pitts, he mentioned that along with many other villagers hehad nor seen any swallows locally this year, but had managed to spot some on a trip to the west Midlands. I saw a few pairs some weeks ago but the days of swallows lining the telephone wires prior to their departure for their winter quarters in South Africa are long gone. On a bright note, Lyn Wilson of Rookswood Farm reported that her large barn was still providing a home for returning swallows that had nested and produced a couple of broods with some certainly going on for a third and overall numbers had increased rapidly.


